New Bus Service To Inkster Road Now Operating

The new DSR Grand River express service from downtown Detroit to Inkster Road went into operation on Monday, March 11. Riding to the end of the line on the very first bus were Chester Downings of 28870 Middlebelt and Miss Lenore Findley of 27419 Louisa Avenue, Livonia.

Both expressed their amazement at the speed and convenience of the new express service, which connects the suburban areas directly with Washington and State Streets in downtown Detroit.

The trip takes 53 minutes. On hand to meet the first arrivals was Leo J. Nowicki, DSR General Manager, and other DSR officials. Mr. Nowicki stated that every effort is being made by the DSR to provide rapid transit service connecting all points in Detroit with the rapidly growing suburban areas.

The Grand River express line previously ended at Seven Mile Road. Express buses leave Inkster Road for downtown Detroit every weekday morning between 6:35 and 8:40 a.m.

Buses returning to Inkster Road leave Washington Boulevard and State Street every weekday afternoon between 4:40 and 6:21 p.m.

anti-God philosophy. So they quit their soap-box oratory and, in the thousands, infiltrated every activity of our economic, governmental and social life. They became influential "progressive" citizens, not advocating Communism or Socialism but gently guiding us into the hands of groups of loyal Americans into actions undermining the strength of our nation.

The Un-American Activities Committee annual report said that it had uncovered "a mammoth nationwide campaign of political subversion designed to paralyze the security programs of the executive and legislative branches of the United States Government."

One of the key security agencies is the Subversive Activities Control Board which has the power to designate any Communist-front organization as subversive, when sufficient evidence is collected, and this render it useless to the Reds.

Trickery And Deceit

In underhand, roundabout ways, the Communists have been trying to destroy the Subversive Activities Control Board. The Communist Party itself openly challenged the constitutionality of the Board. Then it began to swing its hundreds of "fronts" into action, drawing thousands of non-Communists into the agitation against the Board.

One of the instruments which the Reds used in an attempt to sway the Supreme Court justices was an "amici curiae" (friend of the court) brief filed with the Court.

The lawyer who filed the brief told the Court that the petitioners who signed it comprise "a group of prominent American citizens none of whom is a Communist."

The Un-American Activities Committee investigated and exposed this statement as "a deliberate attempt to deceive the Court."

The Committee found that 26 of the signers had been identified in sworn testimony as secret Communists, that most of the other signers had extensive Communist front affiliations. But the most important fact is that among the signers were indeed many prominent American citizens who are not Communists — permitting them selves to be used to tear down our security measures against the Communist conspiracy!
