



Seniors Preparing For Class Trip To Washington, D. C., Last Of May

Seniors are now busily examining the schedule for their forthcoming trip to Washington, D. C. The trip will begin Tuesday, May 28, and last through Sunday, June 2.

The schedule of events includes a full five day tour of the area in the vicinity of the capital as well as numerous activities of a social nature.

The seniors are discussing and making plans for such activities as the Moonlight Cruise on the Potomac, a visit to the "capital building and the tomb of the unknown soldier as well as an excursion to Mount Vernon.

Seniors will board the train at Plymouth Tuesday evening and arrive at Columbus Ohio at 11:40 p.m. From Columbus, the train will pass through Kentucky and over the new River Gorge. After crossing the Allegheny Mountains they will arrive at Charlottesville at 1:55 a.m.

The group will lunch at the Monticello Hotel and tour the Monticello Mansion. Following this, a tour of the University of Virginia will be in order.

The students will arrive in Washington about 9:00 p.m. and go to the Annapolis Hotel where they will stay during the entire visit in Washington.

On Thursday, the students will be taken on an all-day tour of Washington ending in an afternoon visit to Mount Vernon. Following dinner, they will cruise down the Potomac in the moonlight.

Friday, after breakfast, the group will tour the public buildings and after lunch spend the afternoon in whichever manner they choose.

The final day in Washington, Saturday, will include a tour of the Smithsonian Institute and then the final departure for Michigan. The Clarenceville seniors will arrive in Plymouth at 7:15 Sunday morning.

Acting as sponsors of the Senior Trip will be Anthony Marra, Mrs. Mary Lavers and William Waters.

To Go Abroad On Exchange Student Plan

Following the visit of Elda Dossena, Italian foreign exchange student to Clarenceville, a representative will be sent to a foreign country from the school. Miss Gretchen Van Camp was recently chosen from four applicants to go abroad this summer. The choice was made public to the school Friday, March 29.

Gretchen's destination has not as yet been determined, but her trip will begin sometime in late June. She will visit abroad for a total of six weeks.

The foreign exchange program of which Gretchen is a part is sponsored by the American Field Service. The AFS is a non profit organization which began during World War I. The Americans in France at that time volunteered their services as ambulance drivers to aid wounded servicemen. From this association grew what is now the American Field Service.

Last year, one other student in the area was honored with the opportunity to travel in a foreign country. This student was John Newburg from Bentley High School. John spent his vacation in Norway.
