Jehovah's Witness Protest Sent To Soviet Leaders
Charging that Soviet officials "may perhaps be found fighters actually against God," a strongly worded letter of protest from the Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society, legal governing body of Jehovah's Witnesses, has been sent to Premier Nikolai A. Bulganin of the U.S.S.R.

Mr. Ludwig, president minister of the Farmington congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses, in announcing the contents of the letter, cited the wholesale arrest and removal of Jehovah's Witnesses as slave labor camps in Siberia.

"For many years now," Mr. Ludwig said in the letter as saying, "Jehovah's Witnesses within the Soviet Union have endured great difficulties and heavy persecution."

The letter was written to accompany a composite petition that had been adopted over a period of nine months by a total of 492,836 of Jehovah's Witnesses, meeting in 199 assemblies throughout the world.

"We have acted only in good faith," Mr. Ludwig said. "Following the petition's adoption at each assembly, copies were sent by registered mail direct to the Soviet Society's headquarters in Brooklyn, New York, to Moscow to fully acquaint the Soviet government with the true aims and purposes of Jehovah's Witnesses."
