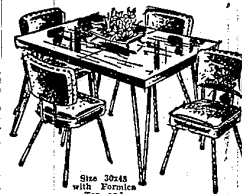

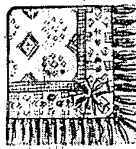

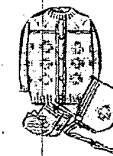

## Motor City Races To Open Sunday

Auto racing will open its 24th season at Motor City Speedway Sunday, April 28. A full schedule of old model races, topped by a 25-lap feature, will inaugurate the first of two Sunday afternoon programs scheduled by Promoter Andy Barto. Trials for these begin at 1 o'clock with the first race at 2:30 p.m. Night racing will start Saturday, May 11.

In keeping with a custom he established, Barto will hold "open house" at the track Saturday afternoon (April 27) between 1 and 5 p.m.

Drivers of old models, hard tops, sprint cars and midgets—everything that will compete at the track this year—will be out for trial runs on the open house card.

In past years more than 5,000 fans have visited the Speedway on Open House Saturday to meet the drivers, inspect their equipment and ask questions. This day, too, fans are permitted in the pits to watch the behind-the-scenes activity.

Next Sunday, however, is the "big day"—when the season-long chase for points and purses begins. From now until Fall the roar of the Speedway will be a familiar—and welcome—sound in the vicinity of Eight Mile and Schoenherr roads.

## Falcons Humble Trojans Behind No-Hit Pitching of Roy Temple

A brilliant no-hitter by Farmington's Roy Temple, April 16, gave the Falcons an easy victory in their opening contest. Playing on the Clarenceville diamond, the Falcons completely surprised the Trojans with a class of ball new in the CHS-Farmington rivalry. This is the first time in five years that Clarenceville has bowed to the Falcons in baseball. Farmington won 10-2.

Temple hurled seven hitless innings against Clarenceville, allowed only two walks in the entire game and hit two men. Errors gave Clarenceville two runs thus spoiling Temple's hope for a shut-out.

Clarenceville threatened early in the game when Larry Andrews was safe on an error and Danny Colgrave walked. The scoring drive was stopped short as the Falcons picked up Carlton's line drive and maneuvered a triple play.

Farmington scored three times in the second inning on three errors and two walks in the game. The blow was a single by Catherine with two on. The Falcons scored two more in the third, fourth and sixth innings and received a finality in the seventh.

The game with Farmington ended Clarenceville's pre-conference

play with a 0-2 record.

The Trojans began League play Tuesday, April 23, in a contest with Holly.

The Trojans will face Bloomfield Hills at Clarenceville this afternoon.

## Coach Hired For O.L.S. High

Announcement was made recently of the employment of a combination athletic coach and teacher for Our Lady of Sorrows High School to take over duties with the beginning of school in the fall. Also planned is a well-rounded and terminal physical education program for the school.

Named as athletic director and coach for all sports was Ronald Mrozinski of Detroit. Mrozinski has directed Detroit's athletic programs, a C.Y.O. Grade League and had a recreation and education directorship in the U.S. Army. He previously served as assistant football coach at DeSalle High in Detroit and assistant basketball coach at St. Gertrude's High in St. Clair Shores.

A fund raising project is already underway by a recently organized Athletic Association in the parish. Hopes are that enough money can be raised to construct a field house, layout a football field and baseball diamond and purchase equipment and uniforms to field teams in all three major high school sports.
