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Capoe, Blouson, Spring In Girls' Lead In Girls' Fashion Fashions

A gentle curve guides the over-the-shoulder, the dress is soft, or puffed by light frothy petticoats. Princess or slightly draped straight, coats are softened by curved lines, and have a wide neckline, by fabric bows. Suits adorned bloused jackets, round-peg-top skirts and more pleats. Top fashion analysts say that blouses have bloused jackets; blousing changes coats; blousing cotton knit shirts have elasticized waistbands; shirtwaist dresses show bloused backs; a blouson jacket or jerkin is a new part for a dress ensemble.

For dress youngsters appear in hordes, from tiny detachable ones which cap the shoulders of spring coats to full-length cape and dress ensembles. There are also some full-length wool capes and cape suits.

Slit rules the skirt silhouette for all but the smallest tots. Lanes are long, look-imperious, and high-waisted, and Easter ensembles for subteen feature slimmer to slim skirts. Pleated skirts, of minimum interest for several seasons, are rising back on the fashion tide.

Bulky knits widen their scope for spring, 1957-long coats and jackets, slim pants, shorts and caps, knit collars and sweaters, trim jackets, and cotton knit makes some of the prettiest dresses.

Back details are most significant still, and are used as a detail rather than basic silhouette. On coats, Empire back details include banding, small set backs, but not to be bloused backs on suits, coats and dresses and huge shawl hovers. Lavender tones are everywhere.

Blue, mauve, pale blue violet are seen in tweed and flannel coats and suits, Dacron and cotton print or silky cotton dresses and silk separates.

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Offer \$38,000 For School Site

An offer of \$38,000 for an elementary school site adjacent to the Wardman Subdivision was made by the Farmington School Board at a special meeting Monday night with Devere Fleming, representative of the Farmington Development Company, owners of the property.

Fleming stated that he was not in a position to enter into an agreement with the School Board for an option to purchase. He indicated, however, that he would present the offer to officials of the company for early consideration.

The site, slightly over six acres in size, abuts Cleveland on the north and the Grand River Cut-Off on the south. It is between the sections of Mayfield on the east and Frederick Street on the west. Negotiations for the highly desirable school site have been under way for some time.

In other action at the meeting, the Board approved the appointment of John Allan as architect for the addition of a new classroom building to the school. He was instructed to proceed with drawings on the proposed addition.

Also discussed at the meeting was the need for another elementary school site between 12 and 13 Mile Roads west of Middlebelt Road.

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Develop Remote Control Car Radio

The newest trick in entertainment for motorists is the remote-controlled car radio receiver with a memory.

Ford Motor Company engineers have developed a radio receiver that can be installed conveniently under the back seat or in the rear trunk.

The receiver is operated by a tiny push-button box on the instrument panel, and the car radio is controlled by a remote control unit having no moving parts and therefore requires less servicing.

MOTION by Westlake, Supported by Avery, that we adjourn the meeting carried over from April 2nd, and stand the regular meeting. Carried.
