### Civil Air Patrol Squadron Planned

Positions are available for squadron officers. Adults over 18 years of age, with or without military experience, are also needed to carry out the Civil Air Patrol's mission of land and air search and rescue. Pilots and people with aviation background are particularly needed; it was pointed out.

Also being planned is the formation of a CAP Cadet Squadron for teenagers between the ages of 14 and 18 who are interested in any phase of aviation.

Flight scholarships, overseas exchange trips and summer encampments in various parts of the United States are available to cadets who can qualify.
