Falcons To Host Inter-Lakes Meet

Farmington High will welcome member track teams of the Inter-Lakes League this year for the Eleventh Annual Inter-Lakes Conference Track Meet on May 23. Each of the schools, which include Southfield, Waterford, Van Dyke, Berkley, Walled Lake, and Farmington, must have their entries in by tomorrow for the meet, which will last from 1:30 - 5:30 next Thursday. Each of the schools will have three entries for each event, except in the 400, where only two entries are permitted. The winning team will receive a trophy, the first place individual winners will receive medals, and second through fifth place winners will be awarded ribbons. Tim Hawkins then followed with a triple to left center but hope was short-lived as Cliff Wellman rounded out short to first to end the rally. The victory for Milford ties them with Clarenceville for first place in the WOOL. Each team has lost one ballgame in six starts.

Brown To Battle Lane At Battalia

Henry (Toothpick) Brown, the knockout scourge of the lightweight ranks, will battle Kenny Lane, the division's top title contender, at the Olympia Wednesday, May 22. Brown, replaces Baby Vasquez, Mexican champion who was injured in training. The switch in opponents may pose a greater threat to Lane's aspirations for an early shot at lightweight champion Joe Brown. Toothpick isn't as experienced as Vasquez, but he is an infinitely harder puncher. In 24 professional victories, Brown has scored 14 knockouts. He is one of those rarest of men who can hit with equal authority with either hand. Brown was Philadelphia's top amateur lightweight before he turned professional in 1951. He has come along steadily, winning 21 times and posting two draws in 30 pro matches. He hasn't fought since he broke his hand against Paolo Rossi on November 2, but the injured mitt is completely healed. He returned to training a few weeks ago. Kaul says that Brown is able to punch as viciously as ever with his right.

State Waterfowl Survey Underway

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recently announced plans for its annual summer survey of waterfowl breeding and nesting grounds. The survey, which began May 1, will continue into August, and provides information used in the preparation of the year's waterfowl hunting regulations. Other valuable information also is provided by wintering ground inventories and the annual kill surveys. This material, when compiled, serves as the basis for the federal waterfowl regulations framework. Each of the states then establishes its hunting regulations for ducks, geese and other waterfowl within this federal framework. State Conservation Departments may set lower bag limits, or shorter seasons, than are outlined in the federal regulations, but may not exceed federal limitations.
