THOSE OUTDOOR STAIRS

In your zeal to tackle new outdoor projects during the good weather, don't overlook little maintenance jobs that will save you expense and worry in the long run.

A lot of people, for instance, neglect to keep an eye on the state of repair of outdoor wooden stairs, such as those attached to prorches and laundry stoops. Naturally, an outdoor stair, being subject to moisture and extremes of temperature, needs a lot more attention than one located inside a house.

The main points to check are the stringers (the pieces that diagonally to hold up the steps), and the steps themselves.

run diagonally to hold up the steps), and the super luminous-Particularly if they were never painted properly, stringers will sometimes crack under the strain of continual use. You can remedy this by builting a two-by-four along the inside, the full length of the stringer. Don't use nails — they might split he wood even more. Three-quarter inche carriage botts, in-serted in 5/16ths holes bored through the stringers and the two-by-fours will do the trick.

If the stringers have a saw-tooth pattern, and these "teeth" e showing signs of rotting, cut the saw-tooth portion off and place it with a triangular piece screwed or bolted firmly into

The steps themselves should be checked for excessive wear (in which case they can be turned over) and for splintering or rough the control of the control of

one or more nonviousi treads.

Finally, when the stairs are back in good repair, don't reglect the one all-important task that will save a lot of trouble
and expense in the thure, as well as giving them a smarter
appearance; give them one or more costs of a good quality
