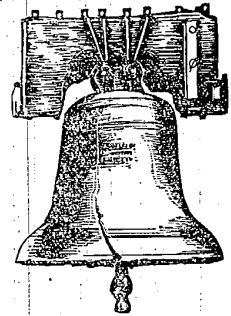
Barnaby was graduated from McKenzie High School, Detroit, in 1953.

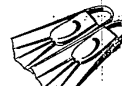

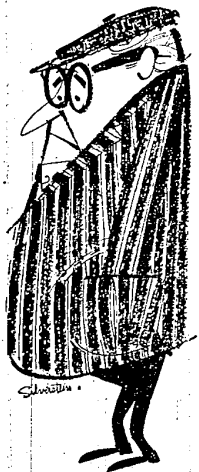
