Local Principal, Teachers Attend NEA Convention

Teachers from all over the United States and its territories are holding a "homecoming" in Philadelphia this week in conjunction with the National Education Association Centennial Convention being held there.

Representatives from the Farmington District in attendance at the convention are: Miss Grannis McCarty, school principal, and Mrs. Florence Coveyou, Mrs. Hazel Breshear, Mrs. Mae Sitko and Miss Lenore Johnson, classroom teachers.

The traditional birthplace of American liberty, Philadelphia was the meeting place 100 years ago when 43 educators from 12 states met in 1837 to form the National Teachers' Association, later on.

Among the many speakers being featured on the convention's programs are: Bruce Catton, well-known author of Civil War history and editor of "American Heritage"; James B. Conant, former U.S. Ambassador to West Germany; and Norman Cousins, editor of the "Saturday Review."

With the theme, "An Educated People Moves Freedom Forward," the convention has drawn between 15,000 to 25,000 teachers. Official convention delegates, number only 5,500, but pre-convention estimates show that even more than the additional 5,000 to 10,000 teachers who have attended recent annual NEA conventions expected to attend this centennial meeting.

Swelling the number is 30 independent departments affiliated with NEA. These serve special interests of teachers from kindergarten to college. Also in session is the NEA's 24 commissions and committees which serve the general interests of education.

The program is also including a convocation of educators with leaders of nationwide lay organizations and representatives of higher education.

In the leading role at the convention is the Representative Assembly of NEA, reflecting on educational developments of the century and the future of schools.

The assembly which determines the association's policies, is composed of delegates from some 6,000 local and state NEA affiliates. They are sitting as state and territorial delegations, including groups from Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico.

Presiding over the convention is NEA President Martha A. Shull, teacher of English at Jefferson High School in Portland, Oregon.
