FARMINGTON Getting a high school diploma was a long, hard struggle for 21-year-old Mike McConatha.

Acar accident left McConatha a quadriplegic (no use of any limbs) at the beginning of his senior year at Redford High School in Detroit.

Two mouths after his accident, McConatha started taking courses at the Rehabilitation Center in Detroit in an effort to earn his diploma. He learned to write with an adapter.

In February, 1971, he was transferred to the Oak Hill Nursing Home in Farmington. At the home he was tutored by teachers from Farmington High-School.

After taking the eight hour GED (general educational development) test, McConatha qualified for a high school diploma. He scored above average on the test which is evaluated at the high school senior level. After the age of 18 the test is required in order to get a diploma.

Dr. Edwin Blumberg, owner of the Oak Hill Nursing Home, presented the diploma to McConatha last week at a pizza party for physically handicapped members of "living opportunities". "For awhile! Inever thought I would make it," McConatha said. "It's like tearing down a wall. After working at it so long, it gives me a great feeling of achievement."

Mrs. Jean Isles, a nurse at the home who has worked closely with McConatha, says it took two years to talk him into this and she hopes he won't stop now

won't stop now!

McConatha has plans to enter Oakland Community College and will major in history of public relations.

"I'm not sure yet what I'll go into, but I like working with people,"

McConatha! says without the help and encouragement of people like Mrs. Isles, he would've never made it.

"It gave me confidence knowing someone really cares."

McConatha is the son of Mrs. George Dougherty of Detroit.




