Tips On Removing Persperation Stains Given

Nina Lou Baird, of Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service, states that it is been on an apposite since the other spousible since the older the stain the harder it is to remove. A reesh stain of this kind usually can be removed by dampening the stained area with water apd then holding it over the fumes of a bottle of ammonia for a few minutes. If the fabric will not water stain, moisten the stained area with a mixture of half ammonia and half water.

If the color starts to fade beyond the stain, during this process, sponge immediately with white vineger and the fading will stop. Stains that have been allowed to Stains that have been allowed to set for a few days or even longer will become alkaline so reverses this process. That is, use a little vinegar on the stain first. Then if the material fades, use the am-monia solution.

monia solution.

Perspiration stains on a white garment usually require bleaching in the sun after the garment has been washed. If the stain does not come out with this treatment, sponge with hydrogen peroxide. Perspiration odors that cling even after washing the garment, may be removed by soaking it in a selt solution made by mixing three tablespoons of salt in one
