N. Congregational Church To Hear Guest Minister From London

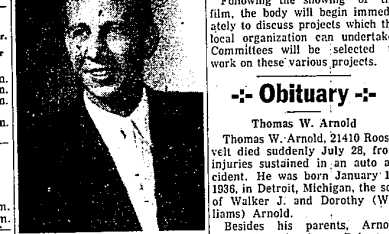
Reverend Albert D. Belden, B.D., D.D., minister of Pilgrim Fathers Memorial Church, London, Eng-land, famous author and religious columnist for the Manchester Evening News, will preach at North Congregational Church, North-western Highway at Lahser, on August 4, 11 and 18.

Dr. Belden is in his forty-eighth year of service as a Congregational minister. He has served with distinction in three pastorates, Banbury, Crowstons, Westfield-on-the-sea (new church built) and Whitefield's Center Mission, London. He is author of many successful books for adults and for children, including the latest biography of George Whitefield and Pax Christi, the fourth edition of which will shortly appear. He is constant contributor to British, Canadian and American religious journals.

He has been chairman of the Essex Congregational Union, president of London Brotherhood Federation, is a co-opted member of the National Free Church council, vice president of the Unitarian Society, member of the National Peace Council, general director of the Pax Christi

Reverend Handside has recently returned from the Congo where he completed four years of service with the Conservative Baptist Foreign Mission Society of Chicago. He prepared for his missionary service by attending the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago. Reverend Handside also graduated from the Central Baptist Seminary in Kansas City. He served in the medical division of the Army Air Force for 21 months.

Mrs. Roberta Handside, a registered nurse, was able to assist her husband in many ways and also helped with the work in a leprosy colony. Following a year's furlough in the United States, the Handsides expect to return to the Congo in the spring of 1958 to continue their work.
