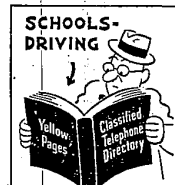
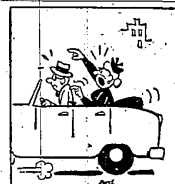

### Spray Juniper, Cedar, Foilage With Sulfur

Cedar and juniper foliage should be sprayed from cedar-apple and Hawthorne rust. Almost all homes have junipers, cedars, apples, or hawthornes in their plantings, and now is the time to prevent the apples and hawthornes from infecting red cedar and juniper.

Don Juchartz, County Horticultural Agent, explains that the cedar-apple rust is a fungus disease which alternated between apple or hawthorne, on the one hand, and juniper or cedar, on the other. If either of these alternate hosts are eliminated, the disease cannot grow and mature. The best control measure is to prevent it from passing back and forth. It can do extensive damage to either of the host plants.

Juchartz recommends the use of micronized sulfur at the rate of 6 tablespoons per gallon of water, at three to four week intervals for four applications. He warns against the use of sulfur at temperatures above 85 degrees, however, because of foliage burn. Select a cool day for spraying, he concluded.

### Oakland County Big Brothers Inc. Seeks Five Area Volunteers

Big Brothers of Oakland County, Inc., is seeking five volunteers in the Farmington area, to work with youths, presently on the Big Brother program waiting list.

"Volunteering is important," points out William L. Clark, Executive Director. "The volunteer and his Little Brother must be of the same general religion, have the same general interests, hobbies and personality make-up, and live in the same vicinity."

"A Big Brother is a man who, working under professional social work direction, offers a lad a sense of belonging. He is a man trained to do the job of being the boy's friend. Much can be done to help a boy who lacks the guidance a father should provide, through the friendship and affection of Big Brothers."

Launched 52 years ago, the Big Brother idea has spread throughout the nation. A Big Brother is a man who gives his own spare time to help a boy in need of mature advice, companionship and most of all, friendship. "He may be a lawyer, doctor, salesman or a factory worker—but he is a Big Brother to a boy who has been in trouble or has lost the companionship of his father," said Jere Gillette, president of the board of directors of the Big Brother Oakland County group.

The idea was born in New York, when a clerk of Children's Court appealed to a church men's club to save the children he saw sentenced to association with adult criminals daily. Ernest K. Coulter's idea, the same used today, is to make an adult a brother and friend to each boy in close, personal association. Coulter had found practically all of the youngsters were from broken homes.

The organizations sprouting from Coulter's idea, affiliated in 1946, Michigan leads in number with agencies in Detroit, Oakland County, Flint, Lansing, Saginaw, Dearborn and Midland.

### Suggest August Garden Planting

You still have time to plant vegetables, according to John Carew, extension specialist in horticulture at Michigan State University. You can plant winter radishes in early August and store like other root crops for winter use, Carew stated. They grow larger than summer radishes but have a very mild flavor.

Turnips, spinach and both head and leaf lettuce can be planted now, Carew says. The salad bowl variety of leaf lettuce would produce the best results.

Green and wax beans can be planted the first part of August also, Carew added.

You may have to soak your garden down pretty well to get the seeds to germinate, he adds.

### Looking Ahead

The Socialist-Labor government, to the nation's foremost banker, and to workers whose work benches and machines in the industries of Norway. I have spent a weekend with a typical middle-income Norwegian family blessed with a handsome 11-year-old son and two beautiful little blonde and blue-eyed daughters—experiencing their mode of living, trying to feel the play of economic and political forces around them. I have gone into the grocery stores, the clothing stores and the appliance stores, and up and down the streets of Oslo (Norway's beautiful capital city, population 400,000) and the picturesque little Baltic Sea coast city of Fredrikstad, 60 miles down the eastern coast (population 15,000).

**NOT PANNING OUT**  
In many other ways, I have tried to size up what Socialism is doing to Norway and Norwegians, and their reactions to it. I believe I have the picture straight. It brings into focus a Socialist-Labor government unable to deliver on the promises of Socialism, but trying desperately—and quite effectively—to pacify the people and keep them in ignorance of their true plight.

In my dispatch next week there will be a statistical sketch and a firsthand report on life under Norwegian Socialism for the family of a typical industrial worker—his income, his taxes, his subsidies, and the other factors bearing on his living standard and his future. Meanwhile, readers of your column may be interested to know that:

**FACTS OF NOTE**  
Einar Gerhardsen, Norway's Socialist Prime Minister and, therefore, the most powerful man in the nation's political scene, is a former worker on a municipal road building crew. His prestige and rise to prominence was built on his political operations. He served as secretary of a small Socialist-Labor party in a medium-sized city.

The Government owned railway trains are equipped with intercom systems which permit the conductor to talk to the passengers. When the train just ahead of the one that brought me to Oslo from a trip through the South of Norway broke down, causing my train to be repeatedly delayed, the conductor's pleasant voice was heard throughout the train informing the passengers of the difficulty and indicating that it would be fun anyhow to stretch one's legs in the bright Norwegian sun along the right-of-way until we were ready to go again.

The voice was so cheerful that only a few people had the bad manners to gripe over the delay totaling more than 20 minutes. This Government practice of buttering up the people is paying dividends to the Socialists who run the country.

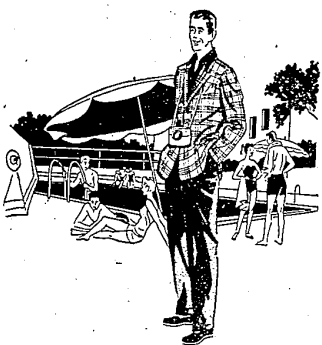
