Probably the oldest form of comedy slapstick in the world—except for pie-throwing—is the antics of a comedian who climbs a ladder to paper a wall, paint a house or repair a roof.

But many a handyman has found to his dismay that the accidents and near-accidents that look funny on the screen are anything but funny in real life.

One of the commonest causes of accidents with a ladder comes from putting it in a wrong position or on unsafe ground. If you want to get to the roof, for instance, put the legs for ladder a distance away from the house equal to one quarter of the length of the ladder. For example, the legs of a 12-foot ladder should be three feet from the house.

If the legs are to rest toon to notice to the nouse.

If the legs are to rest on a slippery surface, such as concrete, it's best to tie them to some firm object on or near the building with a rope or clothesline wire.

Your shoes should be kept free of mud, which can easily make you miss your step and can cause serious wear to the rungs, thus shortening the life of the ladder.

If you MUST climb a ladder in front of a door that swings ard you, make sure the door is locked, then warn the family

Never tie two ladders together for extra length. They will probably endanger you under such unaccustomed weight.

And, finally, make a habit of checking your ladder each you get ready to use it. If a crack is developing or a rung oming loose, you'll be glad you noticed the trouble while were still standing safely on terra Itima.
