Over a period of years, the wasting and the resultant weakness becomes progressively apparent and the patient is confined first to his wheelchair and then to his bed. There are more than 200,000 victims of Muscular Dystrophy in the United States. The exact cause of Muscular Dystrophy is unknown. To date there is nothing known to medical science which can stop this disease. Once the disease starts, it follows a steady, down-hill pattern. While Dystrophy itself is not fatal, the weakness it causes makes even a trifle disease very dangerous. To a Muscular Dystrophy patient the common cold may be a fatal illness.
