We are happy to welcome Mr. and Mrs. Francis McGovern and their two children who have purchased the Brown's home and are moving in today.

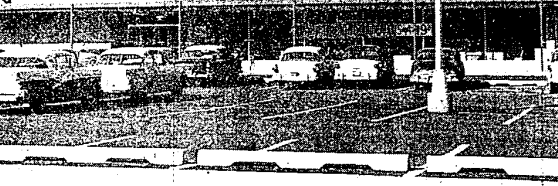


COVERING over 21,000 square feet, the new S. S. Kresge store is adjacent to the Kroger store in the shopping center and both stores carry a continuation of the same design. The

7. Covering over 21,000 square feet, the Kresge store has 1,662 linear feet of convenient front-service counters, with merchandise displayed on tiers for greater visibility and easier access.

8. At six check-out stations located near the entrances and exits, cashiers have been provided with automatic change-computing cash registers and trained to move traffic efficiently and quickly. The check-out system is relatively new to retail merchandising, but has already proved efficient in 230 of Kresge's 688 stores.

9. A luncheonette which seats 24 customers has been installed. Complete dinners, plate lunches and light refreshments will be served during store hours. An illuminated menu card rack has been installed above the mirrored waistcoat for easy reading and quick selection.

10. To insure rapid service, an intercommunication system connects the luncheonette and the kitchen, making it possible for waitresses to place customers' orders immediately.

11. All food is prepared in the store's modern kitchen, which features the latest stainless steel equipment and electrical appliances for faster service. All recipes are prepared for Kresge fountains in the company's Detroit Test Kitchen.

12. Additional conveniences for shoppers include air conditioning, and a public address system over which daily "specials" will be announced. Parking for a minimum of 700 cars is also available in the shopping center's parking lot.

13. Striking in appearance, the facade of the Kresge store is made up of grey face brick and glass paneling. Kresge's is adjacent to the shopping center's Kroger store and both stores' facades carry a continuation of the same design. Kresge's store has no show windows, but a ten-foot-wide canopy over the sidewalk extends across the entire front of both buildings.
