Principal's New Salary Schedule Gets Approval

Livonia School Board President Robert Cain has been meeting with the Principals' Committee headed by Carl Rovee to work out a formula for their salary schedule.

The Board met in executive (secret) session 7:30 last Thursday night for President Cain to talk over with his Board the salary proposals which all agreed to unanimously.

"With the principals accepting our proposal I think one important fact shall be told, stated Cain. "The principals have been willing to go along working with us for a salary schedule they have never really had. This year is just the first step in fulfilling our responsibility toward them."

The base salary of the principals has always been based on the teachers' salary schedule.

Presently this has not changed with the exception of several points of increment arrived at for principals are independent increments.

Their base pay is still the maximum salary for teachers which this year was raised \$300 to \$800.

Maximum salary for elementary Principals is \$13,500; Junior High School maximum \$14,000. Maximum rise is \$800.

Other increments approved by the Board Thursday night were as follows:

Administrative Increments: Increments for the added responsibilities of the administrative position shall be granted to elementary and junior high school principals and high school assistant principals up to a maximum of \$800.

Advanced Training Increment: Increments for advanced training beyond the master's degree shall be calculated at \$10 per semester hour up to a maximum of 30 hours, with \$600 granted for 45 hours or the education specialist's degree, and \$800 for the doctorate.

Administrative Experience Increment: Increments for administrative experience shall be granted, on the superintendent's recommendation, on the basis of \$150 per year for elementary and junior high school principals up to a maximum of ten years; for all assistant principals the amount will be calculated at \$100 per year up to a maximum of ten years.

Annexation Ruling Won't Be Appealed

A ruling by Wayne County Circuit Judge John Wise against Livonia's contention that petitions filed for incorporation of the "city of Westland" were invalid won't be appealed.

Judge Wise handed down his decision July 16, after Livonia Mayor Harvey Moelke had contended that Livonia's petitions for annexation of a northern part of Nankin Township had been filed earlier than the incorporation petitions, and thus should have been acted upon first.

Subsequent changes in boundaries of the land in question were cited by Judge Wise in his decision.

City Attorneys asked Councilmen for a decision on whether or not to appeal the decision Wednesday night, but were told "no."

State Leads Nation In Boating Deaths

LANSING—Michigan, which rapidly becoming the motor boating mecca of the United States, had the dubious honor of also leading the nation in the number of fatalities coming as the result of boat accidents.

Michigan recorded 67 boating fatalities last year to rank No. 1 in the country. Meanwhile, the state rated second in the total number of boats registered at the time of the report with more than 300,000 registrations.

The Secretary of State's office which numbers all motorboats reports registrations, picked up during the warm months this year, and a total

of 335,770 boats have been registered through the first six months of this year.

Secretary of State James M. Harlan estimates that Michigan could register at least 500,000 motorboats if all owners would register their craft.

"I'm sure many persons are unaware that all motorboats have to be registered and numbered," Harlan said. "They may get this registration by paying a \$3 registration fee at any branch office of the Secretary of State, certain marinas, several sheriffs' offices, or by writing direct to our Lansing office, Watercraft, 500 East Michigan

Avenue, Lansing, Michigan.

In other boating accident notes, a total of 257 accidents were reported. Michigan was third in the nation, in this category. Non-fatal injury accidents totaled 83, while property damage was involved in 107 of the mishaps.

Harlan, who is also Chairman of the Michigan State Safety Commission, urged the growing army of boating enthusiasts to observe all the rules of good boating safety on Michigan's many lakes and other bodies of water. Just as in automobile driving, there are good and bad boaters . . . but unfortunately

we have no water point system where licenses can be revoked for bad boating."
