Livonia Educator Directs Counselor Training Plan

Project Cause, an eight-week intensive program to train counselor aides and youth advisors to deal with disadvantaged youth is currently underway at Wayne State University.

Eighty-four trainees are taking part in the 50-hour work program which will continue through Sept. 11. It is being offered under contract with the U.S. Department of Labor. WSU is one of 25 participating universities in this nationwide crash project.

The University's curriculum for the trainees will focus on such courses as labor market economics, the culture of poverty, Employment Service operations, job counseling of youth, job development and job placement techniques.

Secretary of Labor W. Willard Wirtz said: "Not only will the trainees make an important contribution to the war against poverty, but they will be helping to eliminate the hopelessness and despair which are poverty's twin companions."

Union, Board Talk Policy in Schools

Meetings are currently being held between the Livonia Public Schools administrators and representatives of 90 Board transportation employees to formulate recommendations on personnel policies affecting bus drivers. The suggested policy revisions will be presented to the Board of Education for consideration at a fall meeting.

Concurrently transportation and other changes in bus routes, of the additional services to be given under the new State law on non-public schools, and legal or policy changes which affected school children, parents, and the drivers of school vehicles. Assistant Superintendent Ron Upton said, "We are meeting with representatives of employees charged with the responsibility of transporting Livonia youngsters to and from school. We want to make sure that these non-teaching members of the team continue to work under good conditions. If we plan ahead together we can coordinate the work of men and machines and continue to give taxpayers who pay the bill the services they pay for."

The group will pass on to the Board their recommendations on job policies, conditions of employment, and related matters. Transportation employees' representatives were led by Mrs. Mabel Ammon, chairman of the bus drivers unit, and Edward Heymeyer, President of Local 118 of the American Federation of State, County, Municipal Employees.

"Any decisions we make will be based upon what is good for the students," Upton stated. "Most of the problems we have are due largely to the rapid expansion of this school district. The department which transports our school kids and our school supplies has increased five-fold since 1955. As our system adjusts to such rapid growth, we must revise and adjust our policies with our program periodically."
