Plimeth Place Apartments Now Open For Inspection

Looking for convenience, luxury, space and a place where children are welcome? Then you don't have to look any more for you have found it in the Plimeth Place Apartments which were opened at 1401 S. Sheldon Road in Plymouth this week for inspection and leases by the Joseph L. Hudson Realty Co.

The newly constructed apartments—in four sections—include 23 single and 49 two-bedroom units and once again members of the large

Each unit includes a spacious living room with a huge kitchen, dining room combination, a foyer and a large bedroom or two bedrooms as the case may be.

There is central air conditioning, insulated soundproof walls, big picture window, aluminum sliding windows, individually controlled heating, a private swimming pool and covered parking for each unit plus additional guest parking.

The kitchens are electrically equipped with the newest and best equipment, including a built-in exhaust, eye-level control four-burner range and oven and an automatic dishwasher.

The kitchens have continuous feed quiet disposal units, cabinets and counters of walnut grain teakite.

There are tiled center entrance foyers, carpeted lobby and hall and a private basement with room for storage and laundry facilities.

The buildings have a Japanese design from the drawing board of Wah Yee Associates, architectural firm in Detroit.

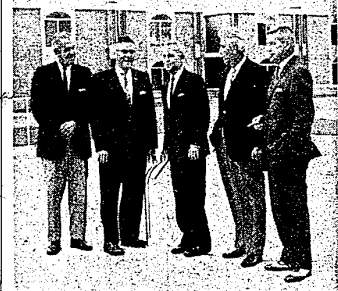

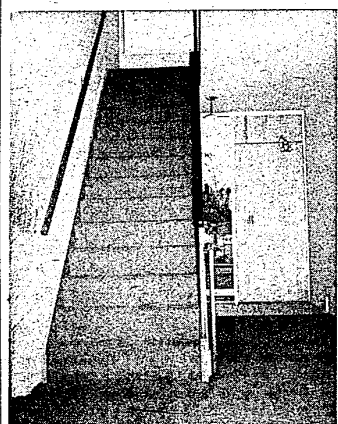

U-M Works On Birth Defects

ANN ARBOR — University of Michigan physicians are testing an electronic urinary bladder stimulator to aid victims of certain birth defects.

The project is one of many now being conducted at the U-M Birth Defects Clinical Study Center with the aid of a \$50,000 grant from the National Foundation—March of Dimes.

Most of the work at the research center is with youngsters who have birth defects involving the nervous, muscular or skeleton systems. The electronic device would be used to treat patients with severe toilet difficulties, says Dr. Donald B. Sullivan, assistant professor of pediatrics and director of the center.

During the past year the March of Dimes has provided financial support for the care of more than 150 inpatients at University Hospital and for approximately 700 outpatient clinic visits.
