12,000 Luther Leaguers Meeting In Cobo Hall

"JESUS IS LORD!" is the theme of the National A.L.C. Luther League Convention, meeting at Cobo Hall in Detroit, August 18-22. Some 12,000 Lutheran young people from the 50 states will participate in the meetings and discussion groups.

Timothy Lutheran Church will be represented by Nancy Kopren, 34500 Grandon, Livonia; Sue Fitzpatrick, 13051 Tecumseh, Redford Township; and Kenneth Kiroff, 35100 Orange-Lawn, Livonia. Other members of the Timothy Lutheran League will act as members of the welcoming committee, known as "Eager Leagues Greeters" or "Luther Leagues Luggage Luggers."

As part of the Michigan delegations they will be identified by distinctive shirts or blouses and antique car horns.

The Timothy delegation and the other young people will be greeted face to face with the great issues of the day by leading spokesmen from the church and leading personalities of the secular world including:

Walter Reuther, President of the United Auto Workers, Louis Lomax, noted author who has criticized the role of the church in the Negroes drive for civil rights, Sir Francis Dham, of Nigeria, a leading political figure in that country's recent move to independence and a president of the World Council of Churches.

Dr. Frederick Schlotz, Minneapolis, President of the American Lutheran Church and the Lutheran World Federation, will lead the long list of church leaders to address the group.

The Chas. Mitchell Trio, and vocalist Miriam Makeba, of South Africa, are among the nationally known entertainers who will take part in the program.

Through the addresses and discussions the convention dele-

gates will see the role of the church in their society and will better understand the problems to be solved by them as citizens.

An insight into urban problems and steps being taken in Detroit to solve them will be gained through the "Listening Witness Program." A series of visits are scheduled to see people either giving or receiving ministry at the Franklin Settlement House and other agencies in Detroit.

A full measure of regular sight seeing trips and business meetings are also planned.

Trinity Baptist Church In Livonia Marks 40 Years Of Growing On Sunday

Forty years ago, on August 27, 1924, 15 persons met in a mission hall on Oakland Avenue, Detroit, and took the necessary steps to bring into being a new church known as Trinity Baptist Church to be a Gospel Witness on the rapidly expanding North-west area of Detroit. For approximately six months the group worshipped in a storefront building at Fenkell and Parkside, later moved to a hall above the Fenkell Theatre, and then on December 11, 1927 moved into their own building on Indiana Avenue near Fenkell. On February 9, 1927 the church was changed to Trinity Baptist since another church had already incorporated as Olivet. Trinity has served the church on the Indiana location, pastored in turn by Rev. C. E. LaFau, Rev. W. G. Mason, Rev. W. F. Hawkins, Rev. P. R. Ware, and Rev. Lyle M. Adams.

In 1958 Trinity began services in a school building in Livonia near a building site purchased on Middlebelt Road with the purpose of establishing a branch church. In 1959 a merger was consummated with the Schaefer Avenue Baptist Church, making possible immediate construction of a chapel and educational wing on Middlebelt just south of Five Mile Road in Livonia. Services were begun in the new building on Easter Sunday in April, 1961, and the last three years has seen a consistent growth in all areas of the church program.

Attendance the past winter has consistently held at the 250 mark at both Morning Worship and Sunday Schools hours, encouraging Trinity congregation to adopt their expansion program for educational and youth club activities at the Middlebelt site.

In addition to the branch church program at the Middlebelt Road location, Trinity has also been conducting a mission Sunday School at the old Union Church and cemetery site on Six Mile Road near Haggerty Road on Livonia's west side. The high school and college-age young people will see the role of the church in their society and will better understand the problems to be solved by them as citizens.

people from the Middlebelt group have conducted this mission Sunday School each Sunday afternoon since last fall. Plans are being developed to begin a Morning Worship service and a Sunday School program at the Union Church location this fall under the leadership of the Rev. Norman Mathias, a member of Trinity Baptist Church, and a graduate of the Conservative Baptist Theological Seminary at Denver, Colorado.
