Livonia Lists New Building Construction

More than \$2.5 million dollars worth of new buildings were approved for construction during July, the Livonia Bureau of Inspection reported today.

The amount included 118 residential buildings, valued at \$1,819,021, and six commercial buildings, valued at \$298,400.

Two hospital additions, 71 garage and accessory buildings, and 68 additions and alterations were also included.

Eighteen private swimming pools were also included. Their value was set at \$41,700.

The new permits gave the city a \$11,085 income for the month. Coupled with electric, heating and plumbing permits, the department realized \$26,209 in fees during July.

19th District Congress Candidates, Kuhn, Burke, Farnum Give Views

(Editor's note: From now until the final election, in November. The Observer will welcome statements on issues by rival candidates for various public offices. We'll edit them, as to length, and will attempt to give the same amount of space, each week, in the same story, to opponents.)

Three candidates for the 19th District seat in Congress, Richard Kuhn, Republican, and John Burke and Billie S. Farnum, Democrat, issued statements to voters this week.

John H. Burke graduated from Redford High School in June 1940 and as a member of the Naval Reserve he was called to active duty in November of 1940 and served with the United States Navy until 1943 at which time he was appointed to the United States Merchant Marine Academy and served in both the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans as an Engineering Officer.

After the war Mr. Burke joined the Conservation Department of the State of Michigan until the latter part of 1947 at which time he resigned to enter Wayne State University for Pre-Law and subsequently went to the Detroit College of Law where he received his Law Degree. After graduation Mr. Burke joined the United States Government as a Patent Advisor and thereafter entered private industry with West Point Mfg. Co. as General Counsel and later General Manager.

In 1962 Mr. Burke formed his own corporation which was subsequently sold and after which Mr. Burke entered the private practice of law with the firm of L. Governor, T. John Ledinski.

Mr. Burke has been active in the affairs of his church, the Boy Scouts and other civic enterprises.

Mr. Burke is married to the former Patricia A. Lord of Farmington and they have four children.

Richard D. Kuhn, candidate for United States Congress from the new 19th District states his position on the following issues:

I am opposed to Medicare based on Social Security. But I am in favor of the Kerr-Mills Bill, which places Medicare on a state level and protects against over-centralization of government.

I am in favor of the United Nations but believe that those who do not pay their dues should lose their right to vote in the General Assembly as provided for in the United Nations Charter.

I am opposed to U.S. aid to communist countries. Time and again this only helps those countries avoid paying the full price of being communist.

In a speech before volunteer workers and precinct delegate candidates at Bolsoford Inn, Tuesday evening, Auditor General Billie S. Farnum expressed personal pride in the leadership America has received in the last three and one-half years, and promised that if elected to Congress he would urge programs furthering the philosophy of Presidents Kennedy and Johnson.

"Witness what this leadership has accomplished. It has brought the country from one of our smallest growth rates to one of our largest. It has taken us from recession to unprecedented prosperity. We have seen the passage of the Federal Aid to Distressed Areas Bill, the Economic Recovery
