

### Livonia Lists New Building Construction

Construction

More than \$2.5 million dollars were approved for construction during July, the Livonia Bureau of Inspection reported today.

The amount included 118 residential buildings, valued at \$1.679.021, and six commercial buildings, valued at \$298,600.

Two hospital additions, Ti garage and accessory buildings, respectively and accessory buildings, where also included.

Eighteen private swimming pools were also included. Their value was set at \$41,700.

The new, permits gave the city a \$11,683 income for the month. Coupled with electric, heating and plumbing permits, the department realized \$28,009 in fees during July.
