Temple School Opens Sept. 10

Temple Beth Am Hebrew [weekly at the Cohn Building of School, which is held twice] the United Hebrew Schools,

Under the supervision of Rabbi David Jessel, with the assistance of the personnel of the United Hebrew Schools, the program teaches the child to reach and understand the Prayer Book and other liturgical Hebrew, as well as to develop a knowledge of Hebrew as a living modern language. "The latter aspect is particularly significant in these days," stated Rabbi Jessel, "when Hebrew is taught in many public schools, recognized as a foreign language requirement for admission to college, and even encouraged by the United States government through National Defense Scholarships."

"Here Judaism is taught as a living, meaningful part of the everyday lives of children growing up in a modern environment, yet without sacrificing the warmth which is so much a part of our traditional customs and ceremonies," explained Rabbi Jessel, in a discussion of the philosophy of the school. From the age of three years, eight months to sixteen, the children are taught Jewish history, Bible, modern Israel, customs and practices, and the ethics of Jewish living. Folk-dancing, arts and crafts, music and dramatics are also taught.
