Burton's Hamlet Comes To Terrace

Sept. 23 and Sept. 24 have been set as the dates for the forthcoming performances of Richard Burton's widely-hailed "Hamlet," to be presented here direct from Broadway at the Terrace Theatre in Electrovision Theatrefilm, the revolutionary new electronic-optical process.

There will be only four performances of "Hamlet" on the two days, with two matinees and two evening performances, at admission prices approximating those for first-run motion pictures. The matinees will begin at 2:00 p.m. and the evening performances at 8:00 p.m. There will be no other performances thereafter.

Seats will not be reserved but the number of tickets to be sold for each performance will not exceed the capacity of the theatre, thereby guaranteeing a seat to each ticket holder.

Pension Fund Investigation Is Slowed

Efforts by Livonia city attorneys to investigate a \$200,000 investment of city pension fund money into the Northwest Mortgage Co. and uninsured home mortgages have slowed during the past two weeks.

A suggestion that the Pension Board ask the City Council for \$350 to help conduct the investigation failed, when Pension board members voted, 2-2, to reject the idea. Mayor Harvey Moelke and Roy Puckett voted for the proposal, but Robert Jackman and Donis Baumgartner cast "no" votes.

So far, city attorneys have not even asked for a writ permitting them to subpoena records and witnesses. Mayor Harvey Moelke said Monday, Judge Joseph Basilio of the Wayne County Circuit Court had promised such a writ when he granted the power of discovery to the city's law department earlier this month. "We need to hire outside technical assistance to help us in this investigation," the Mayor said. "I haven't decided yet whether I'll personally ask the City Council for additional money."

One thousand theatres throughout the United States and Canada will present Burton's once-in-a-lifetime interpretation of "Hamlet" on the same two days.

Starring with Burton in "Hamlet" are Hume Cronyn, Alfred Drake, Eileen Herlie, William Redfield, George Rose and George Voskovec. The production, staged by John Gielgud, was acclaimed on Broadway by critics and public alike, with many calling Burton the greatest "Hamlet" of all time.

Alexander H. Cohen, who brought Burton's "Hamlet" to Broadway, is executive producer of the Electrovision presentation, which was directed by William Colleran and produced by William Sargent and Alfred W. Crown, the chief officers of Electrovision Productions, Inc., developers of the new process.

New Plant to Create 70 Jobs

Extrusion Engineering and Manufacturing Company will erect a 12,800 sq. ft. building on the south side of Schoelcraft Road, west of Leran Road. It was disclosed today by Daniel Andrew, Livonia's Industrial Coordinator.

Mr. John Sassak, president and owner, emphasized that his firm will be the second company in the United States to design, build and try-out toolings for cold extrusions. In addition, they manufacture cold impact steel extrusion parts for other than the automotive industry. There are only three major firms in the country who are engaged in this type of manufacture.

The principal machine which will be utilized in this new operation is a 1400 ton, 23 foot high, Vinegarten Press, having a 24 inch straight mechanical stroke. The uniqueness of this German press is exemplified by the fact that there are but six such machines in the United States today.

The relative newness of cold extrusion work in the United States will possibly lead Mr. Sassak's company to a joint experimental program on cold impact extrusions with Press & Stanzwerk, Ltd., of Eschen, Liechtenstein.

The building has been designed to accommodate future expansion, and maximum anticipated employment will be at the 65 to 70 person level.

Label Tells The Story of Shrinkage

The Sherlock Holmes of the family doesn't need a magnifying glass to solve the mystery of shrinkage of material. All this famous mystery-solver needs to do is read the label on the garment.

'500' Cars To Compete At Flat Rock

The Flat Rock Invitational super modified auto racing championship, featuring some cars which have competed in the Indianapolis '500', will be held Friday night, August 28.

Promoter John Marcum has posted an \$1800 purse for the open competition on the quarter-mile high banked asphalt oval located one mile south of Flat Rock on Telegraph road.

A 50-lap feature, with prize money down to the 15th place; a semi-final, three heats and a dash for the four fastest cars, will be on the program. In event of rain, the meet will be held on Friday, Sept. 4.

Marcum said that sprint cars will also be allowed if they are equipped with full size roll bars.

Among the nationally-known drivers who have already entered are Leo Goldwell of Toledo, Johnny Logan of Charlotte, Mich., and Darryl Harrison of Fremont, O., all of whom have cars formerly raced at Indianapolis. Time trials begin at 7:30, the first race at 8:30 p.m.

Homemakers can do their own detective work. When buying a garment, multiply the shrinkage percentage given on the label by the number of inches in the garment.

This result gives you the number of inches a garment may shrink in length. For example, a dress for a woman measures about 50 inches long; one percent shrinkage would change the length by 5/10 or half an inch. But three percent shrinkage would make a change of an inch and a half, hence alterations would be necessary.

Remember that neither price, look nor feel of a fabric gives a clue to shrinkage.

Look for clues in labels to help you discover degrees of shrinkage. The term "sanforized" on a label means that the fabric won't shrink more than one percent in either length or width. "FRESHKUR" has meaning only when followed by a line telling how much the fabric will shrink, such as "FRESHKUR—will not shrink more than one percent."

"Will not shrink," "shrink proof," "unshrinkable" or "shrinkless" are inaccurate terms.

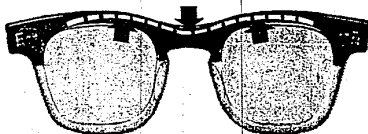

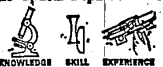
