# Hits Romney Record: Honor Staebler Tuesday at Dinner in Plymouth

Democratic gubernatorial candidate Neil Staebler charged today that Republican Governor Romney has failed to meet his responsibilities in regard to elementary and secondary educational problems.

"The over-riding fact is that the state's contribution to elementary and secondary education, for all purposes, has dropped steadily, from 52 percent in 1950-51 to 41 percent today. This drop continued during the last two years, a time when national prosperity gave the Governor more money to spend than any governor in the history of Michigan," Staebler said.

Staebler will be the guest of honor at a \$25 a plate testimonial dinner at the Mayflower Hotel in Plymouth on September 22nd. The dinner is being organized by the Western Wayne County Staebler for Governor Steering Committee, which includes Livonia, Plymouth, Northville, Redford, Nankin Township, Garden City and West Dearborn.

"This failure has contributed to the rapid increase in our property taxes, which have now reached the point of taxpayer revolt, and we still have inadequate funds for school purposes," Staebler said.

"This shortage of funds is forcing many schools districts to cut back on programs specifically designed to avoid future dependency by our youth," he continued.

Staebler promised that if elected he would take vigorous action to hold the line on school property taxes, increase the general state aid for school districts, and work with the federal government and the schools to see that minimum advantage is taken of the vocational training portions of the President's War on Poverty and other federal programs.
