

Madonna College Adds Four Members To Faculty

The four new faculty members are: Sister Mary Madonna, Sister Mary Louanne, Sister Mary Michaelaette and Mrs. Barbara Jupp.

Sister Mary Madonna, CSF, received her Master's degree in Biology from Fordham University in June 1964. She will begin her college teaching at Madonna, instructing classes in Physical Sciences and Invertebrate Zoology.

Sister Mary Louanne, CSF, received her Master's degree in Nursing Education from Boston University in June 1964. She will teach a course in Pediatric Nursing and another in Foundations in Nursing.

Sister Mary Michaelaette, CSF, with a Master's degree in Nursing Education from Boston University in June 1964, will teach Surgical Nursing.

Mrs. Barbara Jupp, who has a Master's degree from Wayne State University, will instruct a class in Introduction to the study of the history of the United States and abroad, including Fribourg University in Switzerland, Fordham University of Michigan, and Notre Dame.

FAIL ARRIVES NEXT TUESDAY

Autumn will begin at 7:17 p.m. Tuesday (Sept. 22).

The sun's apparent arrival at the autumnal equinox marks the opening of the season when the night becomes longer than day. University of Michigan astronomer Hazel M. Losh explains.

"Since June 21, the sun has been steadily moving southward, and on the day of the equinox it will cross the equator," Professor Losh says.

Equal day and night will

The sun will rise and set almost exactly at the east and west points, and the day and night will be said to be equal.

"Strictly speaking, however, this is not true," Professor Losh points out. "Due to refraction of the sun by the earth's atmosphere, the hours when the sun is actually visible on Sept. 22 will exceed the time when the sun is out of sight by nine minutes."

Robert L. Richardson of 20077 Southfield, president of the Society, said the sessions are designed to "engender keener interest in the discipline of philosophy among faculty, students, alumni and interested members of the community."

Highway Use Rises In State

Motorists drove nearly eight million miles more each day on Michigan highways during the first six months of 1964 than they did during the same period in 1963.

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie said an estimated 18.8 billion miles were logged on Michigan highways between Jan. 1 and June 30 of this year, compared to 17.5 billion during the same period last year.

That's an increase of 7.8 per cent—the largest year-to-year increase in traffic for the first six months that Michigan has had since the end of World War II.

"If the present trend continues—and from every indication traffic was up during July and August—nearly 39 billion miles will be driven on Michigan highways this year, compared to 38.5 billion during 1963," Mackie said.
