# Ascension Lutheran Church Reports Member Increase

After just one year of services Ascension Lutheran Church, 35301 Five Mile Road, Livonia, numbers 223 members, and is one of the fastest growing congregations of The Michigan District of The American Lutheran Church.

At the time first services were held a year ago no congregation, not even a nucleus, existed. Property has been acquired, a church and parsonage erected, and a pastor called by the Commission On American Missions of The American Lutheran Church.

By the end of 1963 a nucleus of 110 members had been gathered. By the time of the congregation's official organization in March of this year the number had grown to exactly 150.

Now, just a year after the first services, the membership is 223. Since the first year of the congregation has more than doubled in size.

During the last six weeks 32 members have been received, and according to the pastor, the Rev. Arnold H. Jahr, there are commitments from approximately 15 families which practically assure a membership of approximately 300 by the end of the present year.
