

**CRIME OF PASSION IN FARMINGTON CITY** f Murder of 'Other N Husband cuse

Homicide in an apartment building rocked Farmington st Wednesday night, and the man who pulled the revolver rigger today sits in Oakland County jail, without bond, charged ith Murder in the First Degree.

A triangle involving a wife, a husband, and another man described by Oakland County Prosecuting office officials seing the backdrop of the violent tragedy.

Dead is Dr. John R. Foster, 41, Birmingham dentist, killed two shots from a .38 pistol. He fell in an entrance foyer of apartment at 32777 Grand River.

Accussed of murder is the husband, Wells Herrington, 45. He is charged with firing the pistol as Dr. Foster charged into the apartment at about 11 pm., the dentist having pre-viously pounded on the door and demunded entimente. the Herringtons commenced divorce proceedings. The date for the divorce to become final was to be this past Monday, five days after the shooting. But last Wednesday night, the Herringtons were together in the Grand River apartment, considering reconciliation, while their daughter was waiting in a car downstairs.

Dr. Foster, according to the Herringtons arrived with the intention of thwarting the reconciliation, and then forced entrance to the apartment. They quoted Foster as saying, "I'm

going to kill you ... Fm going to kill you ... " as he unlocked the door. Funcral services for Dr. Foster were held Monday. His offices were located at 200 F. Brown, Birmingham and he lived at 3130 W. Long Lake, West Bioomfield Township. Two daughters and a son survive, all living with their mother, from whom Foster was allowered. Herrington is a sales executive for a Detroit brewery. He has recently rended the Farmington apatranet, while Mar. Herrington is a sales executive at 2001 Grand River. The Barringtons have five children.



Out in the northern sector of Farmington Township is one of the most eye-attractive high school buildings in our suburban area.
