Curtain Going Up On College Plays —By Wally Roberts

Last week in taking a preview peek at the varied bill-of-fare to be offered on the University theater circuit we didn't quite finish our personal Wayne State's Classical theater, their Bonstelle operation and the Eastern Michigan Players in the technically-perfect Quixote theater complete the coming 30 production forthcoming University season.

The Wayne State University Theater, now in its 25th season, takes justifiable pride in presenting its 14 play season. The historic Bonstelle Theater, "Once Upon a Mattress," the "inside story" of what really happened to the famous princess who was so sensitive that she couldn't sleep when one was under a whole pile of mattresses starts the season. This musical directed by Russ Smith will open the season in a gala atmosphere. "Luther," "Three Men On A Horse," and "Gideon," "The Member of the Wedding," and Shaw's "Androcles and the Lion" follow in quick succession to round out a most interesting season. Season subscriptions can be obtained for as little as five dollars. Order blanks can be picked up or sent for from the Wayne State University Ticket office. The Classic theater will not open until January of 1965, but

already the semi-professional actors are busily at work rehearsing three of the five plays to be presented. "Galileo," "Taming of the Shrew," "Macbeth," "Oedipus Rex" are four of the five classic dramas to be performed. Director Leone indicated to old Wally that the Classic theater was undergoing some renovations that will greatly enhance the productions of the plays.

Eastern Michigan University (Ypsilanti) has a four play season. The season is loaded with fun and laughter. Dr. James Goussieff and his staff have selected lighter fare for audiences in the Detroit-Arbor area. The comedy hit, "Fourposter" is the number one attraction in October. Moving from "The Fourposter," a happy version of the trials, tribulations, and good times found in most marriages, it's but a light-hearted skip to the heart-warming drama of Helen Keller in "The Miracle Worker."

"The second half of the season" in College Theater, the finest theatrical plant in the Detroit-Arbor area, opens with Shaw's "Devil Disciple." George Bird, EMU's talented designer, is fully struggling with the problems of four sets. For "Disciple" the action must be almost continuous. Anyone with

plans for a revolving stage might contact Mr. Bird. "Sound of Music" is a brilliant season of productions. In addition to the four plays the good folks at Eastern Michigan lose in its outstanding international cinemas for good measure. The season coupon book sells for a measly 25¢. Plans for a four dollar package is one of the biggest theatrical bargains in the entire U.S. For information call the box office at TU 2-5455.

Northland Playhouse closed a most successful season with an enjoyable production of

"Sound of Music". After sitting through "Golden Boy" and "Fiddler On The Roof," old Wally had given up and decided that song writers were on strike. Melodies seemed to be a thing of the past. And then I went to "Sound of Music". What a beautiful experience to sit back and soak up the grand old melodies of Rodgers and Hammerstein. Those two gentlemen really knew how to hammer out some whistle-happy tunes. No wonder Ken Schwartz did S.O.M. business with "Sound of Music". I'm

certainly happy he brought it back for a second visit. In fact, I hope the Livonian Redford Guild considers this musical on their schedule for next year. The Fisher Theater audiences greeted "The Merry Widow" warmly and affectionately. The time-honored melodies of Franz Lehar were a welcome relief after all the experimenting of the past two months. Patricia Munsell delivered her songs with gusto and made the evening worth while.

Farmington Duplicate Club Move To WYCA


