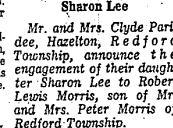
Mrs. Earl Rice was the lucky winner of a beautiful floral center piece donated by the Livonia Florists.

Mrs. Ruby E. Whitmore, recently elected President of the Metropolitan Creative Art Guild is a 24 year resident of Redford Township. She is a mother of two fine children and proud of her four grandchildren.

A graduate of Eastern Michigan and Wayne Universities Mrs. Whitmore has been an elementary teacher for 17 years with the last 15 years employed

by the Redford Union School District at Bulman School, a position she currently holds and enjoys as she likes to work with young children.

In addition to this Mrs. Whitmore is a 17 year member of The Michigan Educational Association, an active member of the local Lola Valley Business and Professional Women's Club for the past nine years and a member of Grace Lutheran Church in Redford Township.

About 10 years ago, Mrs. Whitmore says she took up oil painting as a hobby for many reasons. First, for the opportunity it offered to paint and take lessons with several of her good friends and secondly for the sheer fun and relaxation it offered along with the increasing challenge of competition among the many talented, so called "Sunday Painters" in this area.

Pursuing her art hobby, Mrs. Whitmore has been an active member of the Metropolitan Creative Art Guild for the past also, six years serving several years as exhibit chairman and most recently honored by her election to President. The Guild meets regularly the first Mon-

day of every month at the Bentley High School, Five Mile at Farmington Road in Livonia.
