

Mrs. Pat Secor, the executive director and founder of the Guild, in announcing the season, stated that this year's program offers something for everyone's taste in theatre. She also stated the schedule for the season is packed with previous years and should prove exciting for the area.

Mrs. Beverly Green, the membership director, has announced that the membership drive for active and season members is now in full swing. Mrs. Green stated, "I have only been a

member of the Guild for one year and have enjoyed every minute of it. So many people in the community think you should know so much about theatre to be a member, but that is far from the truth. My husband and I have no desire to be on stage and there are many other members like us. There are so many things to do in a community theatre group, from painting the scenery and hammering nails to selling ads for our show programs and working on various committees. There's a job for everyone.
