

# Michigan First University In U. S. To Accredited High Schools

ANN ARBOR—The University of Michigan was the first institution of higher learning in the United States to accredit high schools, says Kent W. Leach, director of the U-M Bureau of School Services.

"The Bureau has been responsible for the accrediting of both public and nonpublic high schools in the state since 1971," Leach points out.

"Society has evidenced a real concern about what high school programs are being offered to all boys and girls—those who plan to go on to college and those who desire to go immediately into the world and work," he says. "As a result, current accreditation standards relate to all phases of the high school, such as curriculum, qualifications of staff, school plant, and guidance programs."

The University has assigned to its Bureau of School Services the supervision of the accreditation program. The Bureau cooperates with an Accreditation Advisory Committee composed of three representatives of the University, and five members from the state principals' and superintendents' associations, and the office of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Advisory decisions of the Bureau and this committee concerning the accreditation status of schools are subject to the approval of an Executive Committee composed of University personnel appointed by the Board of Regents.

Currently, there are 686 high schools accredited by the U-M of which 323 are public and 123 are nonpublic, says Leach. The program is a voluntary one.

Information about high schools is obtained by having each school submit a detailed annual report and by visiting the schools.

Accreditation visits are made to about 175 high schools each year and each accredited high school receives at least one visit every five years. Some are visited by accreditation teams composed of faculty members from the various schools and colleges on campus, Leach explains.

Others are visited by University personnel and school administrators invited from various geographic areas of the state. Following an accreditation visit a comprehensive report is sent to the local school authorities.

Mr. Irish has arranged for Mrs. Martha Wolf, Cafeteria Director of the Flint Community Schools to present a lecture-demonstration on Commercial Foods Training for High School Pupils. This program will show how high school students can be utilized effectively in the cafeteria while receiving training for a possible occupation.

The afternoon session of the day's program will be presented by Miss Joan Klinger, Dietitian from Stouffer's Northland Restaurant.

### Dodge Sales Set Record For 10 Days

Dodge dealers opened the 1965 model year at a record breaking sales pace, Dodge General Manager Byron J. Nichols said.

Retail sales of Dodge cars in the last 10 days of September, which include five days of '65 model selling, totaled 17,006, Nichols said. That is an all-time high for the Sept. 21-30 period. "Dodge dealers in all parts of the country report heavy sales of the new cars," he asserted. "The new model kick-off appears to be even better than it was last year, when we embarked on a record-breaking model year."

Nichols said sales in the last 10 days of September were 6 per cent higher than in the same period last year, when 16,030 cars were sold.

He said there were also selling days in the period this year compared with eight last year. But he noted that new models were sold in all eight selling days last year while in only five of the nine selling days this year. The new models were introduced on Sept. 20 last year and Sept. 25 this year.

Sales in the last 10 days of the month brought the September total to 90,778—the highest for any September since 1950 and 5 per cent higher than September of last year.
