LANSING
With Michigan's first extensive put-take pheasant
hunting season just around
the corner, applications are
beginning to pite up in the
Department of Natural Resources' Wildlife Division.

The new DNR program, under which hunters will be allowed to take pheasants in certain portions of 15 game and recreation areas, begins Sept. 29 and lasts through March 1, 1974 (with certain exceptions.) The put-take season will serve two purposes:

To provide pheasant hunting recreation over a long (five-month) period of the year on state-owned lands-most of which have been purchased through hunting license revenue, and which have marginal pheasant populations.

Wildlife officials say some 70,000 birds will be released-during the 1973-74 put-take season, which gained the ap-proval of the Natural Re-sources Commission at its July 12-13 meeting in Cadil-lac.

Under the put-také pro-gram, licensed pheasant hunters will be allowed to take two pheasants-of either sex-per day from the desig-nated areas, between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m., prevailing local time.
