Champion Cake Bakers At Sears Bake-Off Doolittle-Schultz

Twelve prize women gathered at Livonia Mall Sears last week for the bake-off of their cake winning recipes. There were four prizes to be awarded.

The women, measured, baked, and frosted their masterpieces in front of the four judges: Edythe Melrose, WXYZ-TV Lady of Charm, Kay Savage, Food Editor of Detroit Free Press, Cy Riley, Food Editor Detroit News and Myra Cox, Women Editor of The Observer Newspapers.

The judges tasted all of the cakes and cast their ballot on general appearance, texture, flavor and volume.

Top winner was Elaine Lampi with Blitzen Cake.

TOP WINNER Elaine Lampi
Time: 20:25 minutes.
Temperature: 350 degrees.

1 cup butter
1 cup sugar
1 egg yolk, beaten
4 tablespoons milk
1 cup flour, sifted
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon soda
4 egg whites
1 cup sugar
1/2 cup chopped nuts

Sift flour, baking powder, and salt together. Cream butter and sugar; add egg yolks, milk, vanilla, and the sifted dry ingredients. Spread in two 8" cake pans which have been greased and lined with wax paper. Beat egg whites until they stand in peaks; gradually add sugar. Spread on top of batter. Sprinkle nuts on top. Bake.

Filling:
1 tablespoon cornstarch
2 tablespoons sugar
1 cup milk
1 egg yolk
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
Bananas

Mix cornstarch and sugar together; then add milk, beaten egg yolk, and vanilla. Cook on low heat until thick. Cool. Turn one layer of cake upside down. Spread filling on it. Slice bananas on filling; top with other layer of cake right side up. Serve with whipped cream if desired.

Cake must be completely cooled before filling is added. If desired, you can sprinkle cinnamon on top of nuts and egg whites.

SECOND WINNER Mrs. Cornelius S. Glock
MOCHA NUT TORTE
Time: 25:30 minutes.
Temperature: 350 degrees.

5 eggs
1 cup sugar
1 cup cake flour, sifted three times
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
5 tablespoons cold coffee
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup finely chopped nuts

Separate eggs and set whites aside. Cream egg yolks and sugar together. Sift dry ingredients together and alternate with coffee and vanilla. Add beaten egg whites and

nuts. Bake in two 8" cake pans.

Frosting:
1 package chocolate or vanilla pudding mix (not instant)
1 cup milk
1/2 cup butter
1 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla

Make pudding according to directions on package but with only 1 cup of milk. Remove from heat and add other ingredients and whip until of spreading consistency. Split cake layers in two and spread frosting between layers and on top. Refrigerate.

Time: 45 minutes.
Temperature: 350 degrees.

2 1/2 cups flour
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup margarine
1 1/2 cups sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
3 eggs
1 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 cup sour cream
1 cup pie sliced apples

Filling and Topping:
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 cup white sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 cup chopped walnuts
Sift flour, baking powder,
