

R.U. Exchange Student Returns Home from Italy

After an exciting and highly educational summer in the city of Gorizia, in Northern Italy, Steve Crane, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Crane of 17409 Norborne, is finally settling down to the routine of school life at Redford Union.

After a ten-day passage on the "Seven Seas," a small ocean vessel which carried nearly 800 other American Field Service students to Europe in late June, Steve arrived at his new "home" in Gorizia, to be the summertime "son" of the Silvio Silvestri's.

Although Steve never saw Mr. Silvestri, a ship captain who had left for Japan before Steve arrived, he thoroughly enjoyed the rest of the family, which included 18-year-old Sergio and twin brothers Franco and Renato, both twelve. The Silvestri live in a "villa," an upper middle class home in this town which borders Yugoslavia.

Here Steve became acquainted with many young and friendly Italian teen-agers, went on bike hikes into the surrounding countryside, and explored the city of Gorizia just across the border in Communist Yugoslavia. "Everything looked new and very progressive on the border," commented Steve, "but farther inside the country there was little sign of progress."

A highlight of the summer was a drive to Venice in the Silvestri family Fiat. Here Steve rode in a gondola and in one of the "boat buses" which handle much of the city traffic of Venice.

School had already begun when Steve and the other AFS students in his section of Europe arrived back in the United States, again aboard the "Seven Seas."

Asked what things were most impressive in the summer stay, Steve was quick to list four—in this order: the "really great" food cooked by "Mother" Silvestri, the mountain scenery, the friendly people, and the red tile roofs!

Be Careful Of Varicose Veins

Varicose veins are dilated, tortuous, venous blood vessels lying just under the skin. They occur most frequently on the inner side and back of the calf and on the inner side of the thigh.

The veins have lost their elasticity and their function of maintaining return flow of blood is impaired. This leads to impaired circulation and consequent decreased nutrition of tissues.

Varicose veins often are a hereditary characteristic, says Today's Health, the magazine of the American Medical Association. Pregnancy and prolonged standing contribute to the condition in pre-disposed individuals.

If possible, choose an occupation that doesn't involve long hours of standing, the Today's Health article urges. Avoid clothing that might constrict the veins at the groin and knee and interfere with blood flow.

When sitting, minimize venous pressure in the legs by elevating them on a stool or chair. When you must stand for long periods, elastic stockings or elastic bandages may be worn—but only on the recommendation of a physician, since complications can develop in persons with additional circulatory conditions.

Varicose veins not only are a hindrance to health, they also are undesirable for cosmetic reasons. Early treatment will prevent complications such as dermatitis or ulcers of the leg. A physician will determine the most appropriate treatment after considering the size and locations of the veins and the age and general health of the patient.
