

Field and laboratory trials show Gaines wheat, if grown in Michigan, is low in yield and flour quality, according to the Michigan State University's crop science department. In variety comparisons made this year by farmers in several Michigan counties, Gaines yielded only 75 to 80 per cent as much grain as the Genesee and Avon white wheat varieties.

"There is no choice between being a political appointee or a voice of a nation. Royalty and elected officials may govern their appointed terms but TRUE journalism reigns forever."

After reading the letter from Mrs. Bruce Duke, of Farmington, in which she takes to task a newspaperman running on a Republican ticket for allowing news coverage and interviews with the opposite party in his paper, I think it is high time to make certain facts crystal clear.

Paul Chandler began his career as a leading sports figure, was then an editor, then a publisher, and lately, due in part to the editorials he had written depicting the government problems of the people of the area in which he lived, he was asked to represent them in the State Legislature. He has never been a politician.

The many explain why some people who look upon a political office as an opportunity for personal gain, are bewildered by his actions. First and foremost, the journalistic profession is bound by a rigid code of ethics. By refusing to use his paper to undermine his opponent, nor to glorify himself, he has lived up to the sportsman's code of never taking undue advantage of a rival.

He has lived up to the demands of the journalistic profession which clearly guarantee any man the right to express himself or his opinions, regardless of the personal opinion or desires of the publisher, when he granted his rival the almost unheard of courtesy of an interview in a prominent place in his paper. One of our most cherished freedoms, that of the press, is involved in any issue of any campaign, is not fully and clearly covered.
