Use of alcoholic beverages by teenagers will come under the scrutiny of a new advisory commission to the Livonia Commission on Children and Youth.

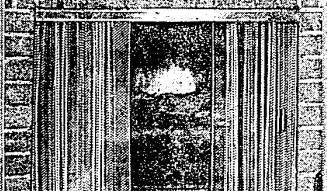
