

Wayne Board OK's 39 District Community College Plan

(This is the fifth in a series of six articles dealing with plans being formulated by the Wayne County Intermediate School District for the eventual formation of Community Colleges in Wayne County.)

After carefully evaluating four recommended plans as submitted in Dr. Robert Keene's analytical report, the Wayne County Intermediate Board of Education voted unanimously to accept the 39 district plan of organization. All school districts, including Detroit, will form one large community college district.

The 39 school district plan involves virtually the entire Wayne County area, with the exception of the northwest corner where Schoolcraft College is presently operating.

The school districts of Plymouth, Livonia, Clarenceville, Northville and Garden City will NOT be involved in the new community college plan since they are a part of the Northwest Wayne County Community College District with their own Board of Trustees.

"We felt the 39 district plan answered the necessary criteria most adequately for an economic and effective organization for community colleges in Wayne County," stated Carl Morris, President of the Wayne County Intermediate Board.

"The combined wealth of all the districts will provide a sound fiscal base for establishing seven campuses throughout Wayne County. In this way we hope to provide more than a 40,000 potential post-high school youth with an increased opportunity for additional education."

Superintendent William Shunck pointed out that the 39 district plan would establish community colleges throughout Wayne County and in this manner meet the interest and needs of the total metropolitan community.

To fully understand the community college organizational plans prior to State Department approval and an election sometime next year, Superintendent Shunck emphasized the immediate formation of citizen study committees.

U-M Plans Study of '64 Voting

ANN ARBOR—University of Michigan social scientists are performing the final phase of a major 1964 election study.

The first part of the study involved the taking of 2,000 pre-election interviews representing the national voting population. Researchers will go into the field immediately after the November election seeking to interview approximately 1,800 citizens.

The 1964 election study represents the eighth in a series initiated by the Survey Research Center of the Institute for Social Research in 1948. Subsequent studies have been conducted for every presidential and congressional election since then, using similar national samples.

The results of these studies have been published in "The Voter Decides," "Group Differences in Attitudes and Votes," "The American Voter" and numerous articles in magazines and journals.

This year's analysis is exploring the factors which influence voting decisions of the electorate. The Survey Research Center staff is particularly interested in the attitudes of the public on major political issues. The study is financed by a \$165,000 grant from the Carnegie Foundation.

The interviews will be taken by professional interviewers employed by the Survey Research Center who will present credentials from the University.
