

### 30 Educators Confer Here on Data Processing

More than thirty Michigan experts in educational data processing will visit the Data Processing Center of the Livonia Public Schools as part of the December meeting of the Michigan Association for Educational Data Systems to be held at 15125 Farmington Road, on Tuesday, December 1, 1964.

The state organization, which was formally initiated this year, included representatives of school systems who are using or plan to use electronic data processing for administration and for instruction, of university departments concerned with teacher education, with manufacturing representatives, and with other organizations serving schools, colleges, and other educational organizations utilizing electronically compiled data.

## Less Clerical Work Seen for Teachers

The prospects for relieving teachers of clerical tasks and getting library materials rapidly to children were the main themes of a presentation in electronic data processing given by George Bageris, supervisor of technical processing for the library services department of the Livonia Public Schools and Dr. Albert Goldberg, coordinator of instructional materials, at the fourth Joint Conference of Instructional Materials at Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo, last Friday.

The conference, attended by 650 Michigan library supervisors, librarians, directors of instruction, and instructional media specialists convened for two days of demonstrations and discussions of ideas relating to improvement of instruction.

The session Dr. Goldberg and Mr. Bageris conducted was entitled, "First Step in Automating Library Services."

"Before looking at modern machines and how they may help us alleviate monotonous work, we must have a detailed work flow of exactly what we are doing," Bageris said. Oftentimes such as analysis reveals that we may need to organize functions better rather than to install and use more machines. Every month a searching look may reveal places where we can be more efficient and productive in our daily work.

## Three Franklin Researchers Attend Science Symposium

Three Franklin High School researchers have been invited to participate in a Junior Science and Humanities Symposium to be held at Wayne State University next Friday and Saturday, November 20 and 21.

Peterson, who has been teaching in Livonia for ten years, received a B.S. from the University of Michigan and on M.S. in biology from Michigan State University. He has been awarded several National Foundation Grants.
