

Parents Without Partners To Hear Dr. Howe Nov. 22

Dr. Ruel Lanphier Howe will speak at the Nov. 22 meeting of Parents Without Partners. Dr. Howe's talk will begin at 3 p.m. at St. Paul's Presbyterian Church at Five Mile and Lincoln Roads.

An Episcopal Minister, Dr. Howe is currently establishing and directing the Institute for Advance Pastoral Studies in Bloomfield Hills. This is a post-ordination training center for ministers of different denominations who have been in the ministry at least three years.

During his eighteen years of teaching, Dr. Howe has served as a counselor to many people besides students, especially in the area of family relations.

A major area of his interest is the correlation of the insights of theology with the insights of the social and medical sciences. He has promised to gear his Nov. 22 talk to the needs of the group.

Rally Day will mark a special effort to call in all members and friends of the West Point Church.

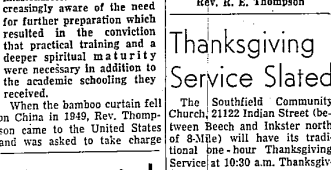
Also included in the Rally Day program is a service of praise and a missionary offering of Thanksgiving.

He became increasingly aware of the need for further preparation which resulted in the conviction that practical training and deeper spiritual maturity were necessary in addition to the academic schooling they received.

When the bamboo curtain fell on China in 1949, Rev. Thompson came to the United States and was asked to take charge of the candidate preparation program for the Far Eastern Gospel Church.

Speaker Tells Scientists How Fear Can Be Conquered

Fear can be conquered by turning wholeheartedly to God, divine Mind, for direction and action, Otto G. Ziegenhagen of Chicago told an audience of Christian Scientists Nov. 15.

"When we are conscious of the infinitude of mind, and its spiritual ideas, there is nothing to fear," Mr. Ziegenhagen declared.

A member of The Christian Science Board of Leadership, Mr. Ziegenhagen spoke at the invitation of First Church of Christ, Scientist in Plymouth.

His subject was "How Christian Science Destroys Fear."

Commenting on the lack, injustice, sin, disease, and threat of war that confront mankind today, the lecturer said, "All these are accompanied by a sense of fear which Truth alone can destroy."

He defined fear in terms of lack of understanding of God's allness, noting that fear is generally connected with the possibility of loss.

"Merely to be told to forget about fear is not enough," he declared. "We must rise above it by realizing the boundlessness of anything opposed to God, who is divine Love."

"Christian scientific practice begins with Christ's keynote of harmony. 'Be not afraid for practical action,' he said. 'The lecturer said, 'Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures' by Mary Baker Eddy."

Complete immunity from fear and bondage is gained through spiritual understanding of the true nature of God and man, and he stated.

Church Stewardship Discussed by Lutherans

The Augsburg Lutheran Church in Redford Township is currently honoring the month of November as Stewardship Month in the Church.

This is how they discuss "Learning How To Give": "Stewardship does not emerge into giving as a natural result in the human mind. We need to learn how to give. We are not born as good stewards with good habits in this thing. We give according to knowledge and faith, not according to ability. Therefore, a sound education program is needed in the Christian church, all of us as Christians, to learn to be participants in such a learning process."

The article in the Nov. 8 issue of the Church paper continues, with the following four rules for giving:

"Dedicate yourself with all that you are and have and all that you receive to God and Christ."

"Set aside a God-pleasing portion of your income first, not last. Do this as often as

you have an income.

"Invest yourself about the work of your congregation and the work of the Church throughout the world and examine the causes of charity that are worthy of support; then determine intelligently how much you will give to each."

"Bring your offering to the House of God each Sunday and make it a part of your worship."

In conclusion the article states "The Christian church has learned some helpful lessons and guides for the steward who is concerned about his giving. It has learned that giving ought to be regular giving, not the kind that waits for some special stimulus or special request. We do not give primarily because there are needs to be met, but we give because God has given to us. . . . We do not give everything we have to be used in our local congregation, because the Christian church in the world is much more than our congregation. We recognize the responsibilities which we have locally, but we also recognize that our responsibilities extend far out into all the world."
