

Wayne County Education Advisor Tells How to Ease Homework

E. J. McClendon, Secondary Education consultant for the Wayne County Intermediate School District, listed five ways to alleviate excessive homework assignments in all school districts as he was interviewed by WJR's Lee Murray on her "Conversations" broadcast.

"We must have more school time devoted to guided learning with direct teacher aid, especially for the less able student," claimed Mr. McClendon. Presently, many teachers merely assign homework and promptly forget to make the assignment a learning situation.

E. J. McClendon, during his broadcast, mentioned several improvements for the entire provocative area of homework assignments:

- 1) Fewer assignments are needed. Give assignments in more detail. Such practice would allow for more careful teacher appraisal of results and additional time for remedial corrective teacher assistance.
 - 2) All homework should be clearly purposeful with students as well as teachers being clear about what the purposes are.
 - 3) More individual project or research-type assignments should be given. Eliminate or sharply reduce the mass mechanical or drill-type assignments.
 - 4) Cooperative scheduling of homework assignments would reduce the pressure on students and would provide time to do a better job. Coordination between subject areas should be encouraged when possible. Flexible deadlines and reasonable time allowances for homework would build beneficial parent-teacher-child relationships.
 - 5) Whenever possible there should be more student initiative and involvement in determining assignments—type, length and level of difficulty. Creative voluntary projects contribute more to the student's educational development and make homework a pleasure.
- Encouragement by teachers and parents should be given to the individual student as he attacks his reading assignments. Best type of encouragement in a most indirect manner is by providing the student with reading on topics of personal interest. Determining the proper individual reading level also increases student interest in his

homework assignment. Homework can create excessive tension in children, especially if the assignments are excessively long. Parent-child conflicts add to the problem when children can't get the assignment all done due to its length. When asked about how home study could be most effective, McClendon indicated that research shows the student needs privacy, freedom from worry, and a quiet place to do his studying. Numerous distractions do make study more difficult. Clear and meaningful assignments spaced at proper intervals which are directly related to the subject area can reinforce the school learning pattern. Homework and good teaching in the classroom are true partners and will stimulate creativity plus perseverance in children if properly applied by educators.

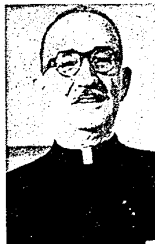
