

# Whose Name Will Livonia's New High School Carry?

Excitement has been high recently in the Livonia community due to the debate of naming Livonia's third high school to be built on Six Mile Road and Whitby Drive.

The new school, to be completed in the fall of 1965, is now referred to as "Section 9 High School." Students in the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades living in the northern subdivisions of Livonia will attend the new school.

Several names have been proposed for the new school. Two weeks ago, at the Board of Education meeting, the name of Eleanor Roosevelt was proposed by Trustee Sirela Schreiber.

The name of Alfred Noble, native Livonian and world-famous engineer, has been proposed by the Historical Society of Livonia, the Franklin High School Historical Society, the Livonia Historical Commission and the American Legion Auxiliary.

Mr. Noble, who was born in 1844 and died in 1914, is recognized as an outstanding

American engineer. He served on the Nicaragua and Isthmian Canal Board for the construction of the Panama

Canal, built numerous bridges over the Mississippi River, built approaches under the East River to Pennsylvania

Station in New York, helped to fortify Pearl Harbor, and received numerous honorary degrees and awards during

his lifetime. At a recent PTA meeting, the name of Edgar Guest, English-born poet, Shakespeare, North-

ern, Betsy Ross and John Hancock were suggested by members of the Livonia community. No name has as yet been de-

ecided upon for the new high school. In 1953 the Board of Education adopted a policy that set the general rule that ele-

mentary schools be named after presidents, junior high schools after poets, and senior high schools after philosophers.

## 3 Teachers Do Research On Atom

The atom is making its impact on high school teaching in many subject areas.

Three Thurston High School teachers on National Science Foundation grants spent last summer studying recent developments in their fields resulting from nuclear research. Another teacher did research at home.

"The effects will be noted in more and more adaptation of old ways of teaching as we strive to speed learning in the same way nuclear tracers have stepped-up scientific discovery," Dr. James Lehman, assistant superintendent for curriculum and instruction, asserted. Shortly, laboratory use of nuclear energy under careful control of the teacher may well be commonplace in our high schools according to Lehman.

In fact, Thurston teachers George Talar, Dick Munson, and Mary Smith are expecting to make a start in this direction next semester. Students will be discussing the curious ways of the atom in biology, chemistry, and physics as a consequence of study last summer by their teachers.

Talar was at the University of California where outstanding work has been done with effects of radiation in biology. He heard Nobel prize winners and became skilled in the use of new equipment.

Munson, Thurston teacher of physical science, studied nuclear developments in the field of structural geology and paleontology at the University of Missouri. Mary Smith, chemistry instructor, was at the University of New Mexico where he specialized in effects of radiation on various animals. Physics teacher Robert Kling spent last summer in individual research on nuclear applications to high school instruction.

## Farnum Speaks To Boys' School

Mr. Billie S. Farnum, Auditor General of the State of Michigan and 19th District Representative to the U.S. Congress, opened Detroit Country Day School's Senior Lecture Series on Wednesday, December 2 with a talk on citizen participation in government.

Country Day's Senior Lecture Series meets every Wednesday afternoon and affords an opportunity for the Senior School to hear talks by leaders in government, business, banking, law, medicine and the arts, and to participate in a discussion period after each talk.

Mr. John Campbell of 23701 Cass Street, Farmington, a member of Country Day's History Department, is coordinator of the Series which runs from December 2 to March 16, 1965.

In instituting these lectures during the 1964 school year, Country Day felt that lectures by the local and state leaders would be helpful in exposing students to the various phases of community activity as seen by leaders in their field.
