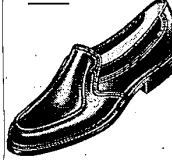

# CD Class All Set to Roll in January

Livonia Civil Defense Director W. A. Cooper has announced that a Medical Self-Help course will hold its first formulation meeting on Tuesday evening, January 5, at 7:30 p.m. The class will meet in the Emergency Operating Center, Police Administration Building, 15500 Farmington Road, Livonia.

This Medical Self-Help training course is designed to teach the proper methods of "survival," as well as how to handle emergency medical problems which could happen in any family. Subjects to be taught include radioactive fallout and shelter, healthful living in emergencies, artificial respiration, bleeding and bandaging, fractures and splinting, burns, shock, transportation of the injured, nursing care, infant and child care, and emergency childbirth.

In addition to this training course, speakers are available wherever it is deemed necessary.

At approximately 6:30 p.m. that night, Mr. and Mrs. Donald Thorneb, returned to their home at 37400 Bonwood, in Farmington Township. Mrs. Thorneb went into the house while her husband parked the car.

Inside, a man with a gun leaped out, and threatened her. Then he ran out of the house, and drove away. She told her husband what had happened. He gave chase.

The chase climaxed on Newburg Rd. and Seven Mile, in Livonia. Nineteen year old Tom Skinner, thinking that Thorneb was chasing a hit and runner — had joined the chase.

The subject of the chase turned and fired five shots at his pursuers. But they kept coming.

Mrs. Thorneb had called the Farmington Township Police. Det. Russ Conway sped to the scene. The Township notified the Livonia Police Dept. and they closed in from the south.

When Det. Conway and Livonia officers Savage and Nawicki arrived Skinner and Thorneb had the desperado planned against the car. Conway describes their action as nothing short of heroic. Chief Yakes was equally enthusiastic.

The man they had tackled was to say the least very dangerous. His name is Arthur Sheehan. He has done 22 years for killing a policeman, and seven and a half for armed robbery. At the time of his last arrest, he was out on bond for breaking and entering in Dearborn.

# Police Catch Prowler

A long reign of fear has apparently ended for Farmington Township citizens — through the effective action of their police department. Ronald Gene Bowers, of Walled Lake, has confessed about 40 incidents of window peeping, exposure, prowling, and larceny.

Sent to check a prowling complaint, Township Officers Jack Brown, and Gordon Ross caught Bowers after chasing him through a field. He denied being involved in a breaking and entering that had just occurred.

Det. Russ Conway found fingerprints, on an attempted breaking and entering, that he believed belonged to Bowers.

Bowers said that if this could be proved, he would clean up a number of similar complaints in the area.

Conway took the prints to Lansing. The State Police there verified that they were Bowers'. The latter confessed to 40 complaints. Among the subdivisions in the Township that he confessed to crimes in were: Holly Hills, Woodbrook, Stansman, and Springfield.
