Family Center Building Now Being Built at St. Alexander's

"Taking the parish to the people" reads like an easy enough plan.
At St. Alexander's Parish, Farmington, where it has been put into literal operation, it has taken some two years from the initial concept of the pastor, Fr. Joseph F. Ryder, to the arrival of the sisters.
And it will be almost another year before St. Alexander's Family Education Center, a total parish educational apostolate, is reaching all age-level groups in the parish, pre-school through adult.
THE FAMILY EDUCATION Center will be much more than just a catechetical center, Fr. Ryder emphasizes, although this will be part of its function. The Sisters of St. Dominic of Media, Pa., who will staff the center will spend their full time in pre-school, grade and high school instruction in religion, in adult education, census work and home visiting.
St. Alexander's Parish, founded in June, 1951, at 7835 Shilwassee, faces the problems that beset many suburban parishes. With about 525 families registered representing a cross-section of living standards and a church, social hall and rectory to pay for, a parish school is one of the projects that has to wait.
Catechism classes once a week and two-week Summer Bible Schools have been implemented since the beginning of the year. A new orientation program on the Liturgy of the Church, introduced by Fr. Ryder.
CHILDREN and adults alike have been exposed and educated in modern liturgical practices, art and music. The Church year has taken on new reality and meaning with and competitions, the learning of new Mass missals identifying with the changing Liturgy. Of-fertory processions and other practices—educating the people directly and actively in the Sacrifice of the Mass.
The liturgical program we have here now," Fr. Ryder explained, "is why I feel this new parish education program will be a success. The people through active participation have had a firm foundation in the Sacraments of the Mass. They have a program like, one which has given them a capacity to appreciate and enjoy."
The Family Education Center becomes reality, the adult classes will be held in a special facility planned as part of the new convent.
Fr. Ryder, Monsignor Edward Burkhardt, director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine for the Archdiocese of Detroit, preached at the 11:30 Mass preceding the groundbreaking for the new Family Center building.

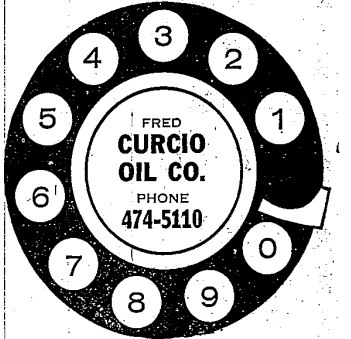
Beth Am Sisterhood Plans First Meeting
