Ever operate a computer? Before you shake your head from side to side, glance toward the telephone. Each time you use this instrument, you, in effect, are operating what has been called "the world's largest computer."

The local telephone central office building in your community houses switching equipment which is part of this giant computer. When you dial a "friend," the switching equipment functions like a computer to set up the necessary pathway to his house.

AT EACH PULL of the dial, your telephone generates a series of electrical pulses. For instance, when the five is dialed, that number of pulses is transmitted over the phone lines to the switching equipment. Three pulses flow over the lines when the three is twirled, and so on.

Switching equipment counts, stores, and processes the digital pulses generated by your phone. Each pull of the dial closes a connection and extends the circuit until the pathway to your friend's house is completed.
