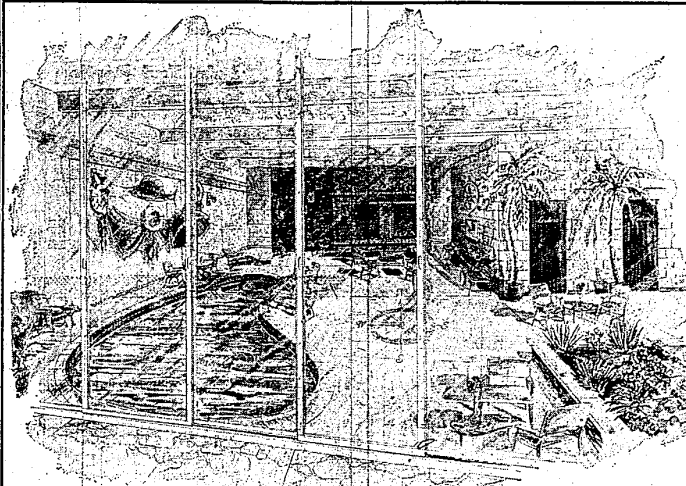
IN THE BUSINESS of the convention, the delegates nominated Robert Derogowski as a candidate for lieutenant governor; James Hare for secretary of state and Frank Kelley for attorney general. Twelve persons also were nominated as candidates for education posts.

Resolutions approved by the convention included support for revising the school aid formula for elementary and secondary education, an increase in state assistance to community schools, readjustment of the state aid formula for public libraries, intensified efforts for manpower training, improvement of the labor legislation in the state, endorsement of an amendment to lower the voting age to 18 years, and disapproval of the two-year registration limit.
