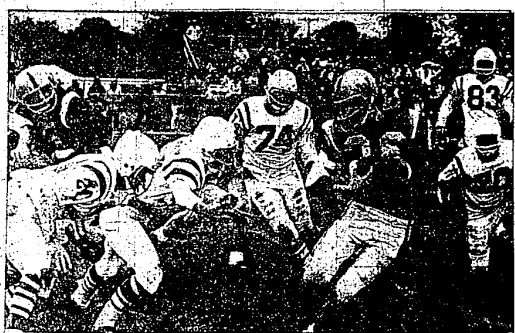

# Falcons Face East Detroit In Another Tough Grid Test

There's no let up in sight for the Farmington High School football team as they face a rugged East Detroit squad Friday night, October 16, in a game that gets under way at 8 p.m. on the East Detroit gridiron.

Falcon coach Jack Hayes will again be sending his eleven out to gain a much heavier test. The East Detroit line boasts an average of 200 pounds a man compared to the 165-pound average in the Farmington forward wall.

After posting three impressive victories to open the season, Farmington suffered a 27-0 setback to defending Inter-Lakes Conference Champions Walld Lake which spoiled the Falcon Homecoming last Friday and now faces a schedule of East Detroit, Waterford, Roseville, Southfield and North Farmington.

COACH HAYES reflected this week that the Falcons have already met their easiest opponents on the 1964 schedule and from here on out it looks like rough going.

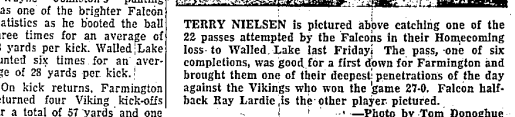
It was certainly rough going last Friday afternoon for the Falcons as the Vikings blitzed them for three touchdowns in the first half to command a 20-0 halftime bulge. The issue was never in doubt and to make it emphatic the Lakers tallied again in the third period and coasted to a 27-0 decision.

There were few bright moments for Farmington as Walld Lake rambled for 333 yards rushing while holding RBFS to 114 yards on the ground.

**THE FALCON** passing attack was not much of a threat to the Vikings, only six completions out of 22 attempts for a total aerial gain of 52 yards. Three Falcon passes were intercepted. Walld Lake intercepted three passes and didn't complete any.

Wayne Johnston's punting was one of the brighter Falcon statistics as he booted the ball three times for an average of 33 yards per kick. Walld Lake punted six times for an average of 28 yards per kick.

On kick returns, Farmington returned four Viking kick-offs for a total of 57 yards and one

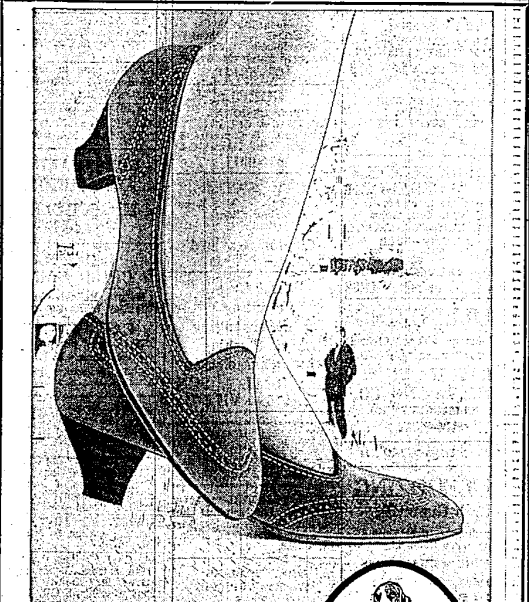
