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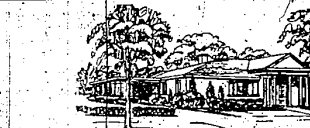

## Stoneware Craftsman Exhibiting His Work

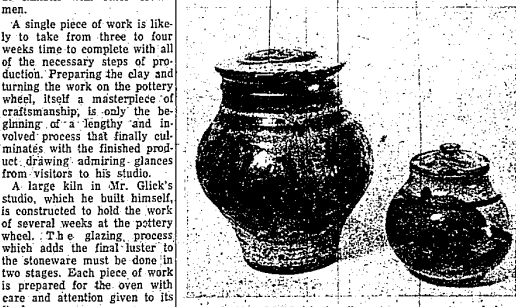
John Parker Gluck of Farmington is exhibiting his work in a special display area where visitors are allowed to browse and perhaps discover a piece they consider a bargain. Mr. Gluck is always willing to explain the flaws which are often times not too obvious to the untrained eye.

THE MAIN DISPLAY area of the pottery is decorated with a rustic touch. Old barn wood is used for the paneling of the display room walls. Shelves are artfully placed along the rough hewn boards to

display a final artistic effect to the finished pieces of stoneware which are placed upon them. Mr. Gluck can be found in his studio on almost any day of the week at work either in a so-called phase of his own pottery making or instructing his apprentices in the art. His studio is located on the south side of 12 Mile Road, just east of Orchard Lake Road, a half mile from the public shop and his stoneware is at his leisure. It is a most interesting place to visit.
