Seven Left Homeless by Blaze Which Swept Their Twp. Home



THE FAMILY OF SEVEN left homeless by a fire last Wednesday afternoon which swept through their Farmington Township home at 25907 Orchard Lake Road, just south of 11 Mile Road, is pictured above. They are Mr. and Mrs. Alger Pawloski and their children, Mary (being held by Sharon Pawloski), Timmy (on his father's lap), Sheri, 5, and Alan, 4, and Jeff, 3.

Fire which swept through a Farmington Township home on Wednesday afternoon, October 14, left a family of seven destitute. All of the five children and the mother, home at the time the fire broke out, were able to escape without injury. The house was a total loss.

Mrs. Sharon Pawloski, 25, was outside the house painting when her sons, Jeffrey, 3, and Alan, 4, came running out to tell her their house was ablaze. The fire started in the back room of the house which is located at 25907 Orchard Lake Road.

Nothing but a charred hulk remained of the back room where the fire had started and the interior of the rest of the house was left scorched and water-soaked. Only quick action by firemen prevented the house from being burnt to the ground.

THE YOUNGEST of the Pawloski children is eight-month-old daughter, Mary. The other children are Jeffrey and Alan, Timmy, 16, and another daughter, Sheri, 5, who attends Alameda Elementary School. Mrs. Pawloski is expecting another baby in January.

Also making his home with the Pawloski's is Gerald Pawloski, 23, a brother of Alger Pawloski. He is employed by Jones and Laughlin Steel Corporation and was out of town last Wednesday.

THE PAWLOSKI'S stayed at the home of neighbors Wednesday night and Thursday left for their five children with relatives. Ruth is a small community in the thumb area where both Mr. and Mrs. Pawloski were born and raised. They bought their house in April of this year, formerly residing in Inkster, Michigan.

Mr. and Mrs. Pawloski are looking for a home to rent in Farmington. Their children will remain with relatives until they can locate a house here.
